

CORRESPONDENCE COURSES FOR CREDIT ACCRUAL EHDE (REGULATION)

High School Single Subject Acceleration through online platforms

Students who entered grade 9 prior to 2023 - 2024, will not be awarded credit for correspondence courses.

Students who entered grade 9 in 2023 - 2024, may take high school correspondence courses from TEA-approved colleges (University of Texas at Austin and Texas Tech University.) Course fees are paid by the parent/guardian. Students will be limited to earning a total of two high school credits and may not earn credits prior to the summer before their sophomore year. Courses requiring a state End of Course (EOC) exam will not be approved by Midland ISD.

Credit shall be awarded for a grade of 70 or above, but no grade points shall be assigned. The grade awarded shall appear on the student's transcript.

Ensuring prerequisites are met for online courses and enrollment procedures are followed will be the responsibility of the online institution. The student's parent/guardian must submit an Online Correspondence Course Enrollment Form, available on the district website, to be reviewed for approval by the campus counselor.
