

C.E. King High School School Parental Engagement Policy 2024-2025

PART I. GENERAL EXPECTATIONS

C.E. King High School agrees to implement the following statutory requirements:

- 5. <u>C.E. King High School</u> will at the request of parents, provide opportunities for regular meetings for parents to formulate suggestions and to participate, as appropriate, in decisions about the education of their children. The school will respond to any such

- 6. <u>C.E. King High School</u> will provide each parent an individual student report about the performance of their child on the State assessment in at least math, language arts, social studies and science by:
 - Mailing home an individual student report about the performance of their child on the State assessment in at least math, language arts, social studies and science.
- 7. C.E. King High School will take the following actions to provide each parent timely notice when their child has been assigned or has been taught for four (4) or more consecutive weeks by a teacher who is not highly qualified within the meaning of the term in section

200.56 of the Title I Final Regulations (67 Fed. Reg. 71710, December 2, 2002) by:

- Mailing home a letter that provides a timely notice when their child has been assigned or has been taught for four (4) or more consecutive weeks by a teacher who is not highly qualified to teach to each parent.
- 8. <u>C.E. King High School</u> will provide assistance to parents of children served by the school, as appropriate, in understanding topics by undertaking the actions described in this paragraph --
 - the state's academic content standards,
 - the state's student academic achievement standards,
 - the state and local academic assessments including alternate assessments,
 - the requirements for using State Compensatory Education funds,
 - how to monitor their child's progress, and
 - how to work with educators
- 9. <u>C.E. King High School</u> will, with the assistance of its parents, educate its teachers, pupil services personnel, principals and other staff in how to reach out to, communicate with, and work with parents as equal partners in the value and utility of contributions of parents, and in how to implement and coordinate parent programs and build ties between parents and schools, by:
 - Conducting semi-annual meetings that will focus on the collaboration of C.E.
 King High School and parents to educate its teachers, pupil services
 personnel, principals, and other staff members how to reach out to,
 communicate with, and build ties between parents and C.E. King High
 School.
 - The details of this meeting will be posted on the C.E. King High School website.
 - Parents will be notified of the semi-annual meetings through School Messenger, the School Marque, the School Website, and Remind 101.
- 11. <u>C.E. King High School</u> will, to the extent feasible and appropriate, coordinate and integrate parental involvement programs and activities with student support organizations such as San Jacinto College, Advise Texas etc.
 - Conduct semi-annual financial aid awareness and workshops. Examples

- include: Financial aid and scholarship night, advanced academics, college fairs, and senior expo.
- The details of these meetings will be posted on the C.E. King High School website.
- Parents will be notified of these meetings through School Messenger, the School Marque, the School Website, and Remind 101.
- 12. <u>C.E. King High School</u> will take the following actions to ensure that information related to the school and parent-programs, meetings, and other activities is sent to parents of participating children in an understandable and uniform format, including alternative formats upon request, and, to the extent practicable, in a language the parents can understand:

- School and parent-program information will be posted on the C.E. King High School website.
- School and parent-program information will be mailed in both English and in Spanish.
- Parents will be notified of school and parent-program information through School Messenger, the School Marque, the School Website, and Remind 101.
