What to expect in 2nd Grade!



Letter Grades

| <u>Letter</u> | <u>Percent</u> | <u>Meaning</u> |
|---------------|----------------|---|
| A | 90%–100% | Exceeds Expectations Performs ABOVE grade-level expectations. |
| B | 80%–89% | Slightly Exceeds Expectations Performs on or slightly above grade-level expectations. |
| C | 70%–79% | Meets Expectations (Average) Performs on/slightly below grade-level expectations. |
| D | 60%–69% | Does Not Meet Expectations (Below Average) Performs <u>below</u> grade-level expectations. |
| F | 50%–59% | Does Not Meet Expectations (Well Below Average) Performs well below grade-level expectations. |

| <ul style="list-style-type: none">• What grades mean. | <ul style="list-style-type: none">• “A 75% means that you meeting or close to meeting expectations.” |
| <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Growth | <ul style="list-style-type: none">• “You are close to meeting expectations in reading. What types of things can you do to continue to grow as a reader?” |
| <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Effort | <ul style="list-style-type: none">• “It looks like you've been showing a lot of great effort in reading? How has your effort been in math?” |

Grades are only one piece of your scholar's journey at Solar. Sometimes she will get an A, sometimes she won't. Help her learn to celebrate growth and effort, learn from mistakes, and always strive to be better.






Blended Learning in 2nd Grade

- Scholars have the chance to correct assignments below a 70.




How to prepare for 2nd Grade:


These are a few ways you can help your daughter prepare for 2nd grade:




- Read with scholar– 15 mins daily.

- Write complete sentences.




- Skip counting numbers by 5s, 2s, and 10s

- Double 10 frames




What are 10 Frames?


