Suicide of a Student

SUMMARY:

All suicide threats, attempts, and completed acts shall be taken seriously by campus personnel and the Mental Health Services Department <u>MUST</u> be contacted with all situations involving student suicide.

The suicide risk assessment may not be used as a basis for disciplinary action. The refusal to consent to a suicide risk assessment may not be used as a basis for disciplinary action.

Depending on the scenario and the extent to which suicide was threatened, attempted, or completed, the departments associated with a suicide crisis may include:

- Counseling Department
- Mental Health Services
- Health Services
- · Dallas ISD Communications Department
- Dallas ISD Police Department
- School Leadership
