**If** you suspect an infant, child or young adult of having a developmental delay or disability, your school can open a window of hope for a brighter future. Services at no cost to the family are available to all eligible individuals from 3 through 21 years of age (starting at birth for auditory and/or visual impairments) regardless of the severity of their disability.

Special services are available to eligible infants, children and young adults identified with a disability who may be experiencing difficulties in one or more of the following areas:

- ◆ Auditory Impairment
- ◆ Autism
- ◆ Deaf-Blindness
- ◆ Emotional Disturbance
- ◆ Intellectual Disability
- ◆ Orthopedic Impairment
- ◆ Specific Learning Disability
- ◆ Speech or Language Impairment
- ◆ Traumatic Brain Injury
- ◆ Visual Impairment
- ◆ Other Health Impairment
