Will TikTok Be Banned?

For a while, TikTok managed to stay off the press' radar except for its rapid growth in 2018. After all, this app was used by most teenagers to dance, hang out in influencer mansions, and do fun challenges. What could be problematic about that?

Time flies by and as the app gets bigger, more people are using it for other purposes than creative fun. There is now TikTok misinformation and extremism that the app "failed" to eliminate. Now, this would have been overlooked had it not been for one reason...TikTok is owned by ByteDance, one of the largest tech companies in China. Due to this, there were growing concerns that the app could be infiltrated by the Chinese government and used to spy on Americans, gain access to user data, and spread propaganda. Other concerns have also been raised about how TikTok may affect its younger users.

On January 25, 2023, Senator Josh Hawley introduced the bill that would ban TikTok across the USA. He stated that "TikTok poses a threat to all Americans" because it "opens the door for the Chinese Communist Party to access American's personal information, keystrokes, and location through aggressive data harvesting."

According to a Pew Research Center survey, opposition to banning TikTok has been significantly higher among younger Americans than older ones. As a result of these remarks, TikTok CEO Shou Chew testified before Congress on March 23 to persuade the public that TikTok does not pose a national security risk. Critics of the ban argue that all social media networks engage in the collection of their user's data. Privacy and security researchers have explained that TikTok in terms of data collecting is not different from other social platforms. The real concern focuses on TikTok and ByteDance's relationship with the Chinese Communist Party. Although a ban may seem like the best solution to some, there are other ways to approach the issue that has been called forward. First, the administration could approve TikToks plan to operate in the United States or push for TikTok's Chinese owners to sell their shares.


Ultimately the concerns of infiltration by the Chinese government are shared across the board with both the US government and TikTok users.

However, the attempt by congress to make it seem like the TikTok app is the only social media platform with a data privacy issue and harmful to younger users is irrational. This debate on whether or not TikTok be banned should instead discuss what should be required of all big tech companies that entertain, inform, and influence millions of users.






