As a part of Skyline P.R.I.D.E and due to the increased safety incidents in schools across America including violence, shootings, and trespassers on campus, we have updated student expectations and student Dress Code requirements.

#### **Uniform Pants**

- Must be a solid color Black, Khaki or Navy Blue.
- Uniform pants or Uniform shorts must be without holes and appropriately fastened at the waist.
- Skirts, Jumpers, Shorts, capri pants must be no shorter than "finger-tip length".
- Sagging pants; sweatpants; biker pants; stocking/hose (being worn as pants); bedtime attire, such as pajamas ARE NOT ALLOWED.
- Blue Jeans (Denim) are allowed ONLY on designated days as specified by Administration. Ex) Spirit days, Free Dress days, etc.

## **Uniform Shirts**

- Must be solid color Black, Red, White or Columbia Blue.
- Polo-style, Button down and turtleneck styles are allowed.
- Skyline spirit T-Shirts are permitted only on spirit days. All other T-shirts ARE NOT ALLOWED.
- Halter tops, under shirts being worn as outerwear ARE NOT ALLOWED.

#### Sweaters/Hoodies/Jackets

- All jackets must be appropriately sized.
- Jackets containing offensive slogans, symbols, and other suggestive or controversial designs are not allowed.
- All District-issued school jackets are permitted.
- Hoodies must not cover the student's head or face while in the school building.

## <u>Shoes</u>

- Athletic shoes, Loafers (Boat Shoes) and Dress shoes allowed.
- All shoes must have a closed toe, and a closed heel in order to be acceptable.
- Slippers, flip-flops, house shoes, slides and crocks ARE NOT ALLOWED.

# ADDITIONAL

- All Students and Staff are required to wear their ID Badge.
- Bandannas, hairnets, bonnets, du-rags, ARE NOT TO BE WORN ON CAMPUS.
- Jewelry or decorative items with offensive language, or any that could be considered obscene, or distracting, ARE NOT ALLOWED on campus.
- All backpacks must be either CLEAR or MESH per district policy.
