





Students who don't achieve SAT (CCMR) standards in the Fall Semester will be prepped and tested.

Texas College Bridge

Online college preparatory courses, strengthening their English and math skills prior to enrolling in college and setting them on a path to postsecondary success. Texas College Bridge courses are personalized, self-paced and teacher facilitated—allowing students to focus on skills they need and skip those they have already mastered, with teacher support along the way. Students receive additional support and resources to help them complete college transition milestones. Plus, at the time of high school graduation, they can earn a TSI exemption at more than 80 partnering colleges and universities across Texas.

WHY AM I COMPLETING THE DALLAS COUNTY PROMISE?

Per the Texas Education Agency, completing the PATH form, completing FAFSA and applying to at least one PATH partner school is a graduation requirement.

Plus! Free tuition to any of the DCP Partner schools.



WHY IS FAFSA/TASFA IMPORTANT?

FAFSA (the Free Application for Federal Student Aid) or TASFA (Texas Application for State Financial Aid) are the absolute best ways to get money for college.

FAFSA and TASFA provide colleges with the information they need to award your scholarships, financial aid, and federal/state loans.

It is first-come-first-serve, so the earlier you apply, the better.

NOTE! FAFSA/TASFA 2024-2025 WILL NOT OPEN UNTIL OCTOBER 2023!

WHY IS APPLYTEXAS IMPORTANT?

ApplyTexas is the application portal used by Dallas County Promise to see qualifying students' "college matches!"

To "match" with a DCP Partner school and become eligible for free tuition via the DCP Scholarship, you must submit *at least one* application to a partner school via ApplyTexas.

(The easiest way for DCP to "match" you is to apply to Dallas College!)
