What's New (Changes from HB 4545 to 1416)

- Schools will no longer need to hold ALC meetings
 - Students who fail in consecutive years will need an Accelerated Education Plan (more details to follow soon).
- Student tutoring requirements can still be met via being rostered in a TIA-designated teacher's course.
- Some students will now only need 15 hours of tutoring instead of 30 hours.
- Students will only need to receive accelerated instruction in two subjects (priority on Math & Reading).
- Group size without a waiver increased to 4.
- Allows parents and ARD committees more flexibility to adjust required tutoring hours

Tutoring Overview

- Students who did not pass STAAR (at Does Not Meet or did not take) in Spring 2023 will require receive accelerated instruction during the 2023-24 school year. Accelerated instruction can be provided by either:
 - Having a TIA designated teacher for the subject they did not pass STAAR.
 - Receiving either 15 or 30 hours of tutoring per subject.
 - Students will be required to have accelerated instruction in at most two subjects. Math and Reading will be the priority.
- Unless the parent has waived the group-size requirement, tutoring must occur in groups of 4 students or less.
 - Group size is recommended to not exceed 6. Maximum group size is 10.
- The district is shifting to a teacher-driven model where teachers will provide most of the tutoring to students (\$50/hour).
- Curriculum will be provided by the Office of Tutoring Services for use when completing tutoring.



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FAQs

Which students need 15 versus 30 hours of tutoring?

30 Hours	15 Hours

All students at Does Not Meet on a 3rd grade STAAR (High or Low)	<ol style="list-style-type: none">1. Can students be removed from core or elective classes to meet tutoring requirements?

Students cannot be removed from core courses or electives that are normally provided to all students in the grade level in which the student is enrolled.

What do teachers need to do in order to tutor and receive the \$50/hour rate?

In order to be paid by the Office of Tutoring Services, teachers must:

- Submit all required compliance documentation to the Office of Tutoring Services by the deadline.
- Log tutoring hours in TutorTrack
- Tutor a group of at least 3 students

Teachers who are not consistently meeting these requirements will not be allowed to continue tutoring.
