

I recently had the opportunity to serve as a founding teaching fellow for Generation Teach. I was selected to participate in the first cohort of teaching fellows for Generation Teach in Texas. As a teaching fellow, I worked with students in the 8th grade in a district where more than 70% were at-risk and more than 74% were economically disadvantaged. In this role, I had the opportunity to help develop and implement lessons on topics such as math and financial literacy. Through these lessons, I provided students with engaging activities that promoted critical thinking skills. Additionally, as a member of Generation Teach's first cohort of teaching fellows, I participated in professional development opportunities that allowed me to reflect on my practices as a teacher and grow as an educator. This reflection allowed me to grow into an educator who is more confident in my ability to address student needs and foster meaningful relationships with students and their families.


I came into the experience with my expectations on the floor, thinking I wouldn't like teaching and would have problems with my students, but that wasn't the case. It was tough at first to transition from sitting in the classroom for so long to being on my feet for eight hours a day, but after about two weeks of teaching, I felt like I had found my groove. I was nervous but excited. I thought it might be challenging to connect with my students, and that they would get bored because of how young they were. But as time progressed, I learned my student's best method of learning: games. I started implementing more math & money games and saw a spark within my kids I had never seen.



I was inspired by the way they interacted with each other and how they were always so eager to learn new things. It was rewarding to see that I could make a difference in the lives of these children I had only met so briefly. This experience also led to personal growth, solidifying my passion for helping others and appreciating my opportunities.

The most memorable moment was when my students wrote notes of appreciation, reminding me that my efforts were not in vain. From funny memories like throwing up at Six Flags to teaching them about my Salvadorian culture and a footshake, this experience was unexpectedly one of the best.

WHAT IS INDIGENOUS PEOPLE'S DAY?




In 2021, Gov. Greg Abbott signed a resolution to recognize the second Monday in October as Indigenous Peoples' Day. While Texas was not the first state to celebrate Indigenous Peoples' Day, this change was necessary and much needed.

Beginning in the 1970s, Native American and international activists began calling for a change to Columbus Day. Due to his violent treatment of the Taino people and the beginning of European colonialism, many called for replacing Columbus Day with a day to celebrate and learn about the Native cultures and peoples of the Americas. Pres. Joe Biden was the first president to celebrate Indigenous Peoples' Day and make it a nationwide celebration. Texas is home to multiple Native American nations and has one of the largest Native American populations in the United States. Even one of your teachers has close Native American tribes, with Mr. Darbonne being an enrolled member of the Natchitoches Tribe of Louisiana. Celebrate this day by learning about Native American peoples, our culture, our history, and our triumphs!

Breast Cancer Awareness Month is an important month to bring attention to. Raising awareness about breast cancer, its prevention, early detection, and treatment are important to help keep people informed. Breast cancer is a form of cancer that starts in the cells near the chest area and can spread to other areas around the chest like the lower neck area and towards the sides of the chest. Although it is mainly found in women, it can also affect men. Breast cancer can sometimes be detected late since symptoms can remain dormant or not be very severe at first.



Although the main cause for breast cancer is still not directly known, factors like genetics, gender, age, lifestyle, and exposure can cause the abnormal growth of cells in the breast area. Breast cancer can also be treated in a multitude of ways depending on how someone wants to approach their battle with it and on the severity of their sickness. Many of the options for treatment include mastectomies (surgical operation to remove the breast), radiation therapy (using xrays to kill the cancer cells), different forms of therapy such as chemo and immuno-therapy (using chemicals to kill cancer cells), and even clinical trials (testing new methods of treatment). However, precaution can be used to reduce chances of breast cancer or detect early signs. Some things you can do are regularly performing self examinations of the breasts, getting mammograms or getting examined by a doctor, limiting the use of dangerous chemicals, and knowing your family history.

According to the American Cancer Society, about 1 in 8 women will develop breast cancer, which also leads to the statistic that about 43,700 women will die from breast cancer in the year 2023. We not only need to bring attention to this, but the fact that in this moment there are more than 4 million breast cancer survivors in the United States which still includes women still being treated and those who have completed treatment for breast cancer. Keep fighting ladies!


