AWARENESS MONTH - NOVEMBER


November is National Diabetes Awareness Month. Diabetes Awareness helps to inform the public about the disease and prevent diabetes related health problems. Both Type 1 and Type 2 Diabetes result from an inbalance in insulin in your body, however they are treated differently. Diabetes can affect your heart, kidneys and nervous system. Although Type 1 is genetic, the best way to prevent Type 2 Diabetes is not to exaggerate your overall consumption of unhealthy foods like those with high sodium, and sugar, or ones that don't contain any beneficial proteins. In the United States, more than 1 in 3 people have prediabetes, but many of them don't know that they have it. This month is not just to show and encourage people to take initiative in their health, but to teach others that they aren't alone with the diseases they live with in their lifetime.

During the month of November we are also recognizing COPD and Antibiotics Awareness. This month we get to highlight three important things in one to show everyone that people with diseases or those who have to take antibiotics are included in this world. COPD, chronic obstructive pulmonary disease, is a group of diseases that affect the heart, lungs, and blood. These people often suffer from respiratory problems. Raising awareness allows people to be informed if they are at elevated risk of maintaining and developing these diseases and how to possibly prevent them with

things such as giving up smoking. This month is also an opportunity to expand awareness about antibiotic resistance and the significance of appropriate antibiotic usage in healthcare.
