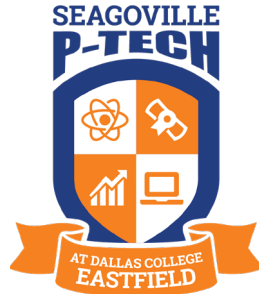


Seagoville P-TECH



Seagoville P-TECH at Eastfield College, the first of its kind in the state of Texas, is perfectly positioned to launch students into STEM-related careers. P-TECH stands for Pathways to Technology Early College High School and gives students access to courses that provide the academic, technical, and workplace skills that are attractive to employers.

With the backing of industry partner AT&T, students will receive hands-on experience and mentoring in the following pathways:

Enrollment Criteria

Seagoville P-TECH is designed to serve incoming ninth-grade students who are:

- Determined to attend college.
- First-generation college students.
- Historically underrepresented in higher education.

The academy will accept up to 125 ninth-grade students per year, and students will move together as a cohort as they progress through high school.

Students will attend ninth and tenth grade at Seagoville High School in a dedicated wing of the building. For their junior and senior years, students will attend classes on the Eastfield College campus. Transportation will be provided at no charge.

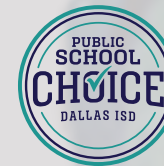
Building a Legacy of Leaders

Seagoville High School empowers students to learn by providing a rigorous curriculum, promoting collaboration using multiple response strategies, and allowing students to be stakeholders in their own education. Seagoville High School has implemented several programs and research-based instructional practices to improve students' educational experience. Seagoville P-Tech Collegiate Academy students can earn up to 60 hours of college credit and an Associate of Applied Science degree in their choice of business administration, personal computer support, or software programming from Eastfield Community College while completing their high school coursework. The outstanding Dragon staff connects with parents and the community through PTO and the Site-Based Decision Making and Campus Improvement Plan committees, hosting progress report pick up nights, parent meetings, and encouraging volunteering and parent participation in school activities. In addition, our community coordinator conducts regular home visits to assist parents in connecting with their student's attendance and progress to keep them on track to graduate college-ready.
