LEARNING SNAPSHOT

Year 1 have enjoyed another week! The children have started learning about money in Maths and have been exploring a range of coins and notes. They have also been using coins to make amounts. The children are getting ready for sports day and have been practising their underarm and overarm throws.

Ask me: To name some coins and notes



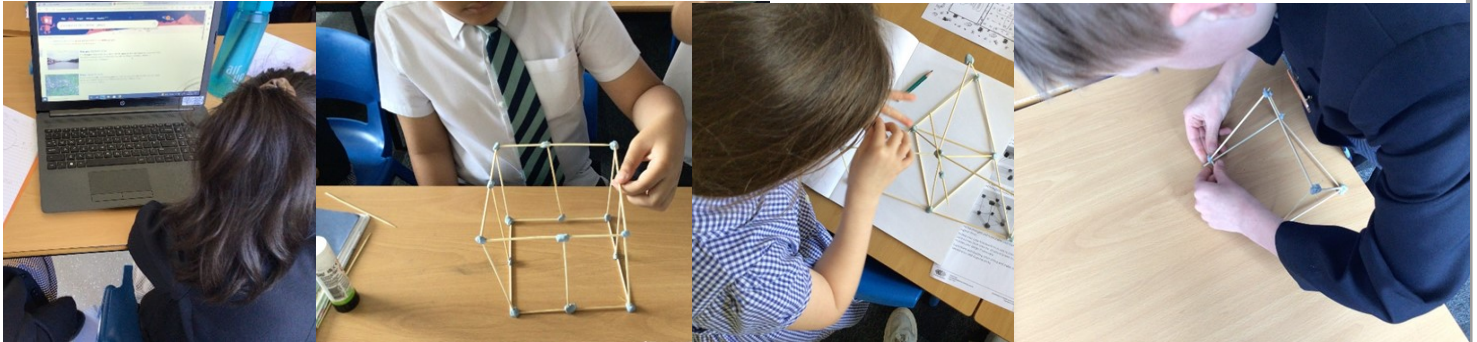
Year 2 have been learning all about living things and their habitats. They visited the Eton Natural History museum to bring their learning to life. At school they have carefully considered the habitats in the school grounds and then designed, planned and made their own 'basin pond' to improve the habitats in our school grounds.

Ask me: What is a Habitat?



Year 3 had a week of researching information for their RE unit to creating 3D structures in DT! In our Maths unit 'Shapes', we learned the different mathematical terminologies used to describe 2D shapes to identifying different lines and angles. In Art, we discussed what it means to be a botanical artist, by studying different plants, fruits and vegetables. As young designers, we made and evaluated handmade structures, identifying which 3D shapes made held a strong form.

Ask me: How did you improve the strength and ability of your structure?



Year 4 This week the children completed a problem solving activity in Maths with triangles. They looked for patterns between the number of triangles in each row and number of lolly sticks. They discovered patterns and rules such as adding two and multiples of three. On Monday, Year 4 spent time on the new play equipment which they all thoroughly enjoyed. They are all incredibly grateful to the PTA for fundraising and making this happen. In RE we finished our topic, investigating the four gospels.

Ask me: Who wrote the four gospels?



Reception have been busy this week continuing their On the Beach project and this week we have been focusing on seas and oceans. We have been discussing the importance of keeping oceans clean and the damage that litter can have on the environment and its wildlife. The children have also enjoyed exploring with atlas' and Google Maps and have had a go at creating and labelling their own world map. We have been looking at different fish in the ocean and then built their own pirate ships with the construction materials outside.

Ask me: what do the blue and green colours represent on a world map?
