We have several exciting developments to look forward to as we close the 2023-2024 school year and plan for the 2024-2025 school year.

In December 2021, the Mother Seton School Board of Directors partnered with Mount St. Mary's University Center for Catholic School Excellence to lead our school community in preparing a five-year strategic plan. The purpose of the plan is to ensure we are on the right path in ensuring the future of Mother Seton School, cultivating a community that will grow in faith and excellence while staying true to our legacy and traditions. I am excited to work with members of our community to implement this strategic plan to ensure Mother Seton School's strong future.

We are also thrilled to announce a transformative addition to our school community – a brand-new chapel! Thanks to the generous donation of Donna and TJ Demmon, this chapel will be constructed in memory of their son Christopher, Class of 1988, who passed away in 1991. We have included drawings of the chapel in this issue so you can visualize how it will fit in our building.

The new chapel will have room for up to 30 people, providing opportunities for our students to experience uplifting Liturgies, moments of reflection during Reconciliation, the serenity of Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament, and more – all within this beautiful new space. It will be a visible sign of our Catholic mission and a reminder of the true presence of Christ, who is at the center of our community. As our Foundress has said, "God is everywhere, in the very air I breathe, yes everywhere, but in His sacrament of the Altar, He is as present actually and really as my soul within my body; in His sacrifice daily offered as really as once offered on the Cross."

Construction is set to begin as soon as the design and permitting phases are finalized. We anticipate the chapel will be ready for use within the next year, providing a lasting impact on countless students, faculty, and staff. Our deepest gratitude goes to the Demmon family for this remarkable gift given in memory of their son, Christopher, to Mother Seton School.

I look forward to keeping you updated on the construction and our progress in implementing the strategic plan. Together, these initiatives promise an even brighter future for Mother Seton School, one that fosters academic excellence, spiritual growth, and a deep connection to our Catholic identity.

NEW MSS CHAPEL

It is with great joy and excitement that we are announcing the addition of a new chapel at Mother Seton School!

The gift is given by Thomas and Donna (Fitzgerald) Demmon, MSS '63, in memory of their son Christopher J. Demmon, also an MSS alum, Class of 1988. Chris died unexpectedly in 1991 as a result of a car accident.

The new MSS chapel will be built across from the Ed and Helen Reaver Family Media Center at the old entrance of the building. The new addition will extrude an additional 10 feet from the front of the current building and will be visible from Creamery Road. This private chapel will accommodate seating for one classroom and will provide a sacred space for teachers and students to use for Mass and other prayer activities throughout the year.



MSS students experienced several exciting events and adventures over the last few months. Here are a few highlights from several field trips and awards.



school code of conduct. The Vincentian Virtue Award aims to acknowledge and celebrate individuals who embody the values of compassion, integrity, and respect.


