

Summary: Campus Performance Objectives

The Dallas Independent School District, in collaboration with the district administration, has adopted four Student Outcome Goals to be achieved by 2022. The focus is to increase student performance at all levels along with increasing student participation in extracurricular activities.

The Dallas ISD Board of Trustees established four goals during the 2015-16 school year as well as targets created within each goal to be reached by 2022. Additionally, the Dallas ISD Board of Trustees created academic indicators for each ensuing year. One can find the 2018-19 target for each goal in the four goals below along with the ensuing results:

Goal 1: Student achievement on state assessments in all subjects in Domain 1 will increase from 39% to 49% by 2022 (44% 2018-2019 target)

Overall, 64% of all campuses (141 out of 221 campuses) were at or above the 2018-19 target while 43% exceeded (96 out of 221 campuses) the 2022 Goal.

Additionally, 73% (107 out of 147) elementary schools, 31% (11 out of 36) middle schools, and 61% (23 out of 38) high schools were at or above the 2018-19 target

Goal 2: Student achievement on the 3rd-grade state assessment in reading at the Meets performance level or above will increase from 35.6% to 45% by 2022 (40% 2018-19 target).

46% of all elementary campuses (66 out of 144 schools) were at or above the 2018-19 target for reading at the Meets performance level or above.

Goal 3: The percent of graduates who are college, career, or military ready (CCMR) from Domain 1 will increase from 45.0% to 56.0% (This lagged 1 year) (46% 2018-19 target)

78% (28 out of 36 campuses) of all high school campuses were at or above the 2018-19 target.

Goal 4: Student participation in extracurricular or co-curricular activities will increase from 59% to 82% by 2022. (87.3% for Elementary, 83.8% for Middle, and 70.8% for High Schools 2018-19 target)

77% of all elementary campuses were at or above the 2018-19 target.

56% of all middle school campuses were at or above the 2018-19 target.

66% of all high school campuses were at or above the 2018-19 target.
