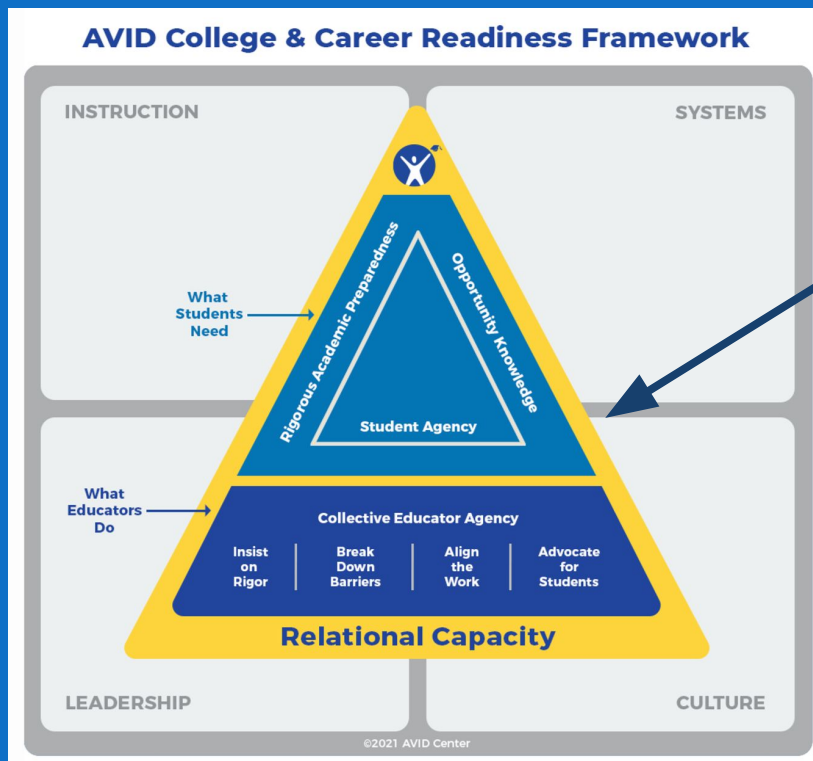

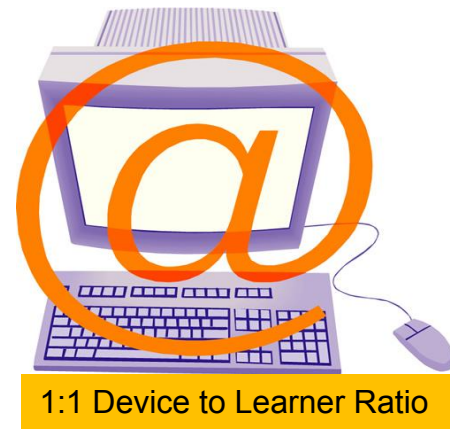

Continue to refine the Focused Note-taking Process, focusing on students' completion of summaries on a variety of formats.

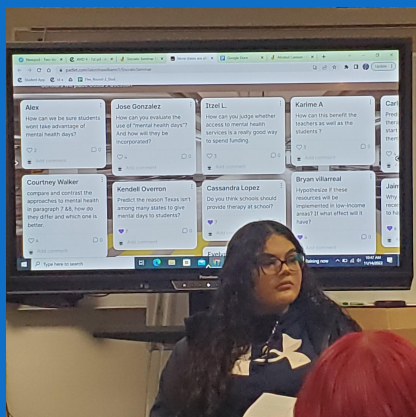
Current Action:

Demonstration Validation Team Recommendation #2



Refine inquiry strategies, specifically Philosophical Chairs and Socratic Seminars, so that all students have an equal voice and that there is a forum to share their ideas.

Current Action:

- Utilizing Padlet/Jamboard allows all students to place their best Costa's questions on the digital board, **focusing on Level 2 or 3 questioning** for their peers to review prior to beginning their Socratic Seminar.
- Jamboard is used as an additional **student voice** tool when students are collaborating and having open conversation about a topic.
- Students debrief as a whole group to discuss session findings and areas of refinement.



Demonstration Validation Team Recommendation #3



Continue to refine tutorials, especially in the area of group members' questioning and the completion of the steps so that these could be duplicated.

Current Action:

- Students consistently use **Costa's levels of questioning** level 2 or 3 during tutorials
- Students give peer feedback if the presenter's question is not formulated as a Level 2 or 3
- Updated presenter's **30 second speech** to **60 second speech** & **60 second synthesis**
- Updated the use of presenter summary, POC to TQ, and whole group reflection

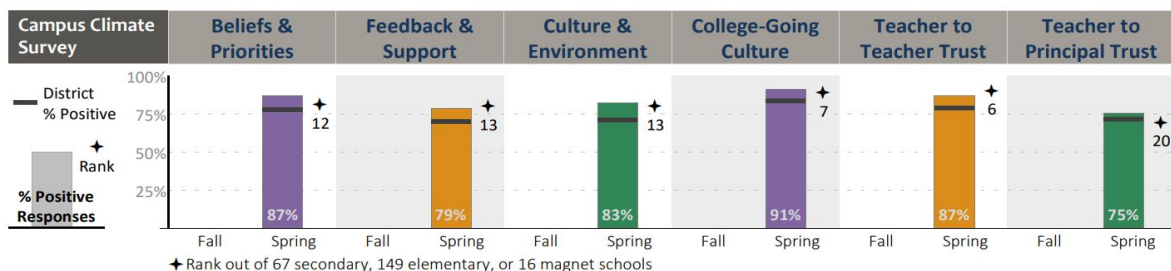
