
10TH GRADE STUDENT

Two students here at North Lake ECHS were recently accepted to the CBYX program in Germany, CBYX (Congress-Bundestag Youth Exchange) is an immersive exchange program jointly offered by the U.S. and German government. The students are allowed to learn about different cultures and get to study abroad. Our first student accepted to this program is Analiese Ayala Henderson. Analiese heard about this opportunity through her former German teacher, Mr. Macias. Mr. Macias has not only been a great teacher but a wonderful mentor. He has given her great advice and has helped her throughout the application process; he even continues to support her after she has been accepted. The steps that Analiese had to take consisted of sending out her application and waiting to see if she got accepted into the semi-finals. Once she found out she was a semifinalist, she completed a survey, an introduction video for her host family, and a semi finalist interview over Zoom. Then they gave her the news that she was a finalist and was given a week to either accept or decline the offer. She accepted and later filled out a second application, which consisted of medical information, letters to her host family, and more information about herself. For Analiese, she felt that the application process was easy; it only took her two days to finish. Most of it was about herself, her hobbies, recommendation letters, and lastly they give you a set of questions in which you have to reply with paragraph responses. What got her interested in this program was the opportunity to travel across the country and be in a new environment and culture for free. Here is what Analiese is most excited about learning "I believe the culture as a whole is something I'm most excited about learning in Germany; The idea of coming back fluent in a new language, having the experience of tasting different cultural foods, and the way of life for a German student is something I am most excited about." The hardest part of leaving for her is the thought of missing out on things and her family making memories without her. Some ways she will try to adjust is by seeing the way the people in her environment work/act and try her best to fit in. 


