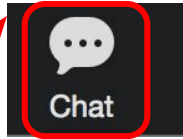

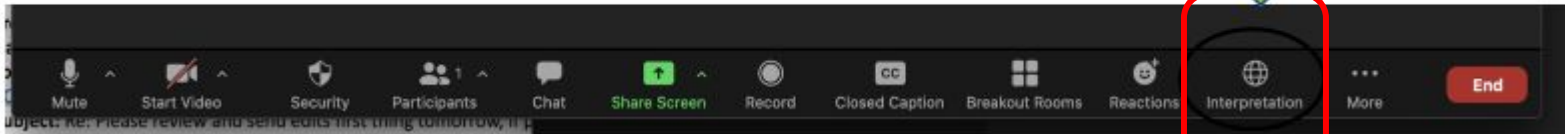

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COVID-19 Updates



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COVID-19 Updates

- Dallas ISD requires that face coverings be worn by all DISD faculty, staff, and students.
- Dallas ISD COVID-19 Dashboard will continue to monitor and track COVID-19 cases across the District.

- Faculty, staff, and students are expected to self-screen prior to reporting to campus.

Dallas ISD to return to masking in all district facilities

HEADLINES

Effective Tuesday, August 10, to protect staff and students from the spread of the highly contagious Delta variant of the coronavirus, Dallas ISD is temporarily requiring all staff, students and visitors to wear masks when on district property.

The announcement comes as the Centers for Disease Control (CDC) and Dallas County Health officials have raised the COVID-19 alert to level red and reported that hospitalizations are rising at the fastest rate since the pandemic began, among all age groups, including children. Students under 12 are not eligible for a vaccine, however, school attendance is mandatory, and virtual learning is not an option at this time.

In keeping with the top priority of safeguarding the health and well-being of staff and students, the district will continue to provide masks and sanitizer at district facilities and will continue contact tracing.

Governor Abbott's order does not limit the district's rights as an employer and educational institution to establish reasonable and necessary safety rules for its staff and students. Dallas ISD remains committed to the safety of our students and staff.



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Safety and Security at North Lake College



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Safety at North Lake ECHS

- North Lake is an open campus, meaning other students and adults will be present.
 - Adults will be stationed at strategic locations during arrival, lunch, transitions, and dismissal.
- Students will be required to wear their Dallas College and Dallas ISD ID badges every day. This requirement will be heavily enforced, as it is the only way we can identify our NLECHS students.
- Confirming short term and long term evacuation plans with Dallas College.
 - Short Term Evacuation--North Lake Soccer Field/Lot 21
 - Long Term Evacuation--Loos Field House
- All guests will be required to check-in with Ms. Cruz in Building L.
 - Photo ID Required



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Student Behavior

- Students will be required to behave like responsible college students and are subject to Dallas College code of conduct/Dallas College Police.
- North Lake ECHS students must be trusted.
- Students will not be monitored like a typical high school and irresponsible/noncompliant behaviors cannot be tolerated as it poses a serious safety concern.



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Friday Night Lights

- Friday Afternoon Detention or Friday Night Lights will be the primary consequence for Level 1/Level 2 offenses and other minor infractions (dress code, tardies, missing homework/classwork).
- Parents/students will have seven days notice prior to being assigned Friday detention
- Failure to attend an assigned FNL will result in, at minimum, a mandatory in-person parent conference the following week.

Rationale:

- ❖ FNL is an intervention designed to ensure that students do not fall behind in their high school and college coursework.
- ❖ FNL is a restorative practice for DISD student code of conduct level I infractions.

- ❖ Every Friday from 3:45-4:45pm
- ❖ FNL will run with a weeklong "lag" as outlined below. This ensures that parents/students have ample time to coordinate transportation.

Friday Night Lights Procedures:

- ❖ Friday Night Lights tracker will be updated no later than 5:00pm on Thursday of each week.
 - This gives a week's notice to parents and students so that after-school transportation can be arranged.
 - Teachers will use common google sheet to opt students in to FNL for academic concerns.]
 - Any student failing a DC class during progress monitoring must attend FNL
- ❖ Ms. Sublet will schedule a callout on Friday at 5:00pm to students identified on tracker (callout will be scheduled for Friday and Thursday at 6:30pm).
- ❖ Ms. Sublet will have paper notifications distributed to identified students on the Friday before their assigned date.
- ❖ On Friday, students will be picked up at 3:30pm and escorted to the F.N.L location (TBD).
 - Campus Monitor and administration will be responsible for picking up students.

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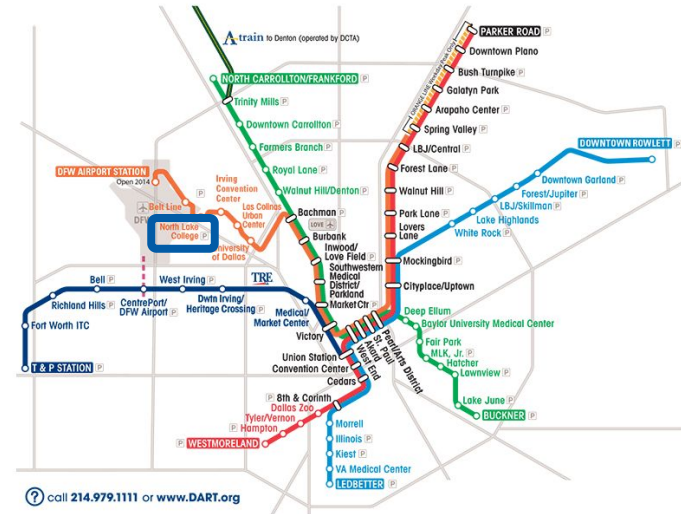

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Dual Credit and TSI



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Dual Credit

Can Result in Suspension or Expulsion from Program

- A dual-credit class is a class that counts for both high school and college credit.
- Passing these classes is required for a student to be on track to graduate for both high school and college.
 - Failing/dropping classes can result in Academic probation, suspension, expulsion.
- Classes contribute to college GPA!



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Academic Dishonesty

Can Result in Suspension or Expulsion from Program

- Includes **Cheating, Plagiarism, and/or Collusion**
- Academic dishonesty is a serious offense at North Lake ECHS. **Students can be given a failing grade on an assignment or test, can be failed for the class, or can even be suspended from college.**

Hats, Other head coverings	Only head coverings that are religious in nature should be worn in the building.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Hats/beanies • Bandanas • Hoods • Visors
School ID Badges	School ID badges must be worn in a visual place at all times. Lanyards must be used.	

No items containing offensive slogans, symbols or other suggestive or controversial designs may be worn.
