The agency's primary focus is on providing food to Clay County residents, but they sometimes help with utility bills and prescription co-pays for existing clients. Their food pantry includes non-perishable items, frozen foods including meat, produce, baked goods, household and personal items. Government commodities are available on the 2nd Thursday of each month. They also help with school supplies in August and holiday assistance in Nov/Dec.

Emergency rent and utility assistance. Eviction notice or utility shut-off notice required. Must meet income guidelines and have income sufficient to meet monthly household expenses after assistance. May receive help every 12 months. Love INC also offers holiday assistance and the Happy Bottoms diaper program. Three-year limit on diapers; no diapers/pull-ups after 4th birthday. 50 diapers/30 pull-ups per month.

Energy Assistance - A one-time payment for one fuel type for heating or cooling costs from October-May.

Energy Crisis Intervention Program (ECIP) - Helps pay your energy bill when you have a termination or disconnect notice indicating a specific disconnect date, a final billing statement advising the account has been terminated, or a propane-fuel oil tank filled at less than 20% capacity.

- Winter ECIP is available November—May based on funding. The maximum amount you could get is \$800.
- Summer ECIP is available June—September based on funding. The maximum amount you could get is \$600.
- Contracted agencies may also provide emergency services such as blankets, emergency lodging, heating/cooling replacement or repair, window air conditioners, or wood stoves.
