F. Niel Postlethwait Middle School's Principal, Dr. Kristina Failing, acknowledged Detective Alfonzo Jones III, Delaware State Police Troop 3 Youth Aid Unit, for his dedication and service to the parents and students of Caesar Rodney School District. She shared a presentation of student comments along with a Postlethwait student who shared his own personal story.

## Superintendent

- Dr. Fitzgerald also acknowledged Detective Jones for his service.
- Dr. Fitzgerald congratulated all of the individuals recognized this evening this is truly a special place.
- Dr. Fitzgerald took a moment to recognize the children in our school district whose parents serve in our Armed Forces. While April is the month of the Military Child, we must take time each month to consider the sacrifices and challenges that these children face. Last week the students from Welch and Air Base Middle school met with the Governor and our chorus performed for both houses of the legislature.
- Dr. Fitzgerald shared that this afternoon our State Championship Wrestling Team was recognized by the House of Representatives and Senate.
- Dr. Fitzgerald congratulated our four Teacher of the Year Finalists: Amanda Hobbs Simpson, Kristin Thompson - Fifer Middle, Ashlee Upp - Allen Frear and Kimberly Weber - Welch. He also acknowledge Mr. Kyle Hill the current District Teacher of the Year.
- Dr. Fitzgerald congratulated our Secretary of Education Scholars. He stated we will recognize them during senior awards night.
- Dr. Fitzgerald shared that last Monday the Delaware State Police presented a Community Based Seminar Program to 30 residents at CRHS. He thanked Det. Kersteter and Sgt. Gaglione. They had previously done the presentation for the entire CR staff.
- Dr. Fitzgerald shared that the Equalization Committee met and the formula will remain frozen for another year. This is good news for CR and the other Kent County Districts.
- Dr. Fitzgerald attended the last Consolidation Task Force meeting. The bottom line is the Task Force recommended reassessment and referred other issues to the GEAR committee.
- Dr. Fitzgerald has a concern over Dover projected Public Safety Fee. He doesn't believe that a tax on us would be legal. A one or two cent scenario will cost the district between \$592 and \$1,184. He wonders if the district can tax the city of Dover for providing educational services to its residents.
- Dr. Fitzgerald commended Mr. Jason Bonner, the administrators, staff and the students of the Charlton School for the way in which they handled a challenging situation last Wednesday at Blue Rock Stadium. Everyone did their job and our students were kept safe while transportation was secured for our other students.
- Dr. Fitzgerald shared some upcoming events:
  - Governor Carney will be visiting Caesar Rodney High School on May 1<sup>st</sup> at 8am.
  - The Prom will be on May 5<sup>th</sup> at 8pm at the Modern Maturity Center.

Our students do not have to make up any days and will have their last day remain on June 7<sup>th</sup>. He stated 10-month faculty and staff will now have their last work day on June 14<sup>th</sup>. He recommended the staff and faculty may use their available personal leave days, give extra time either directly before or after their normal work day or come in until June 14<sup>th</sup> to make up this time. Principals will track this time and certify weekly time using a Goggle Doc.

Mr. Joe Hartman, CREA Representative, also reviewed the proposal. He said he has received positive feedback.

Mr. Bush made a motion to approve the modification to the 2017-2018 School Calendar as presented. Mr. Marasco seconded the motion and the motion carried unanimously 5-0 (Marelli, Failing, Bush, Wilson and Marasco).

## Nellie Hughes Stokes Elementary School Roof Replacement

Mr. Ken Starke, Supervisor of Facilities Management, discussed the Nellie Hughes Stokes Elementary School Roof Replacement with the Board. He shared the bids came in well above what was expected and they will hold this project and reopen the bids in the fall.

Mr. Starke also updated the Board on the John. S. Charlton School bids.

#### Discussion Items

#### Projected Constable Fees

Mr. Scott Kessel, Director of Business and Finance/Support Services, explained the Projected Constable Fees. He shared figures and stated each constable would be approximately \$50,000 each. School Resource Officers are approximately \$75,000 each. There is a difference on what their respective duties include. He stated the process on receiving a constable is through the Delaware State Police.

Dr. Fitzgerald shared his information received from other districts who are currently utilizing constables. He stated this should be funded by the state for the safety of our children and not from local funds.

The Board would like to lobby our legislators to fund this for our district.

## Transportation Updates

Mr. Jason Bonner, Transportation Supervisor, and Mr. Scott Kessel, Director of Business and Finance/Support Services, gave an update on Transportation regarding bussing, contracts and schedules. They discussed the change in bell schedule for the current year and how successful this has been for our students, instruction, and cost efficiency throughout the district.

Dr. Fitzgerald asked about the loss of future bus routes with our contractors due to lack of drivers. Mr. Bonner stated we could absorb a few but not many.

#### Directors' Reports

Directors' reports, which include their Supervisors' reports, were included for the Board's review.

President Marelli asked about Dr. Noel's meeting with Kelly Educational Services. Dr. Noel shared the meeting was successful. Our fill rates are in the upper percentiles and stated they are hoping the contract related to long-term substitutes will roll over into the next year.
