Mr. Scott Kessel, Director of Business and Finance/ Support Services, explained the Budget/Fiscal Reports.

Vice-President Marelli made a motion to approve the Budget/Fiscal Reports as presented. Mrs. Precourt seconded the motion and the motion carried unanimously 5-0 (Marelli, Precourt, Bush, Wilson, and Marasco).

2. Proposed reduction in educational programs and staff in anticipation of proposed state budget reductions.

Mr. Scott Kessel passed out information on the budget reduction recommendations. Dr. Fitzgerald explained the information in detail regarding the breakdown of the cuts: Statewide Educational Operating Budget Reduction, Health Care Cost Share and Double State Share Elimination, Energy Reduction, Transportation Reduction and Education Sustainment (Statewide). The plan to address the first reductions was reviewed. Trading in vacant positions, which also mean units, will help us reach the amount needed to be cut. Discussion took place regarding supporting the new bell schedule and route consolidation so the district would not have to RIF (Reduction in Force). Dr. Fitzgerald reminded the Board that teachers must be notified by May 15<sup>th</sup> regarding their position for the next year. Mr. Wilson asked when the final decision on the reduction in educational programs and staff needs to be Board approved since things could change. Mr. Kessel stated by June 30<sup>th</sup> a final decision must be made. President Bush stated the district plan has been made to address this reduction and the presentation was well put together. The Board thanked everyone for doing a great job on having a plan in place with the uncertainty that lies ahead.

ce-President Marelli made to table the proposed reduction in educational programs and staff as presented. Mrs. ecourt seconded the motion and the motion carried unanimously 5-0 (Marelli, Precourt, Bush, Wilson, and Marasco).

Vice-President Marelli made a motion to accept the contracts E1-E6 pending DFM approval for John S. Charlton, Caesar Rodney High School and the New Elementary School A/E as presented. Mrs. Precourt seconded the motion and the motion carried unanimously 5-0 (Marelli, Precourt, Bush, Wilson, and Marasco).

## 7. Approval of the 2017-18 SY Bell Schedule

Mr. Jason Bonner, Transportation Supervisor, explained the 2017-18 SY Bell Schedule and obstacles that we are faced with: decrease in drivers, transportation cuts, etc. He reminded the board that a committee made up teachers, parents, administrators, and board members was created and they met twice to discuss the bell schedule changes. The committee recommended Option #1 which allows for a half hour earlier start time for middle and high schools and a five minute adjustment to the elementary schools and allows the time needed for buses to do additional bus runs per day. Dr. Fitzgerald asked if we could purchase another bus for CR from the state. Mr. Bonner stated we could possibly purchase another bus from the state, but this comes with additional obstacles such as finding mechanics, housing the buses, finding drivers, etc. Discussion continued regarding creating a 3-5 year strategic plan and revisiting the bell schedule in the future. The Board agreed that a plan needs to be created for future transportation obstacles. Details were discussed regarding the bell schedule and the start times. Vice- President Marelli expressed concerns she has received regarding the early start times. She asked for a fifth option adjusting the entire schedule fifteen minutes. This was also presented for consideration. Dr. Fitzgerald added by approving the bell schedule we are handling a problem we are facing today. If the situation should change, we would be able to revisit this. He reminded the Board that this problem is not only a district issue, it is also a state wide issue.

Tr. Wilson made a motion to approve Option #1 of the 2017-18 SY Bell Schedule as presented. Mrs. Precourt seconded motion and the motion carried unanimously 4-0 (Precourt, Bush, Wilson, and Marasco) (Marelli abstained).

## A. <u>Directors' Reports</u>

Directors' reports, which include their Supervisors' reports, were included for the Board's review.

Mrs. Precourt asked about the Kelly Temporary Services contract. Dr. Michael Noel has met with the company and the district is pleased with them at this time.

Mr. Marasco asked about the updates on McIlvaine. Mr. Ken Starke stated we are on track and there will be a plaque presented upon completion.

## B. Studio JAED

Studio JAED 's proposed CRHS site plan was presented to the Board.

Studio JAED presented a budget update, schematic design submission, athletic fields plan, and timeline update. The Board was polled and asked for their opinions at the end of the presentation. (Marelli, Precourt, Bush, Marasco were in favor with Wilson having no comment).

#### **Executive Session**

At 9:34 p.m. Vice-President Marelli made a motion to go into Executive Session. The purpose of which was to discuss personnel items. Mrs. Precourt seconded the motion and the motion carried unanimously 5-0 (Marelli, Precourt, Bush, Wilson, and Marasco).

10:55 p.m. Vice-President Marelli made a motion to come out of Executive Session. Mrs. Precourt seconded the notion and the motion carried unanimously 5-0 (Marelli, Precourt, Bush, Wilson, and Marasco).
