

TEACHING & LEARNING

The Portola Valley School District teachers and staff envision a dynamic landscape where evidence-based instructional materials and practices serve as the foundation of education. PVSD IS A COMMUNITY FUNDED DISTRICT

Over 90% of funding for our schools comes from within our District community residents in the form of property and parcel taxes, and generous donations from the Portola Valley Schools Foundation.

Hundreds of Portola Valley students, staff, and community members attended the District's ribbon-cutting ceremony on October 20, 2024, to officially celebrate its two state-of-the-art campuses. This milestone is a testament to PVSD's collective commitment to excellence in education, and the voters' commitment to provide an exceptional learning environment for its students. The dedication and hard work invested in the creation of these cutting-edge learning spaces underscores the District's values and emphasis placed on education, intellectual growth, and development of students.

All year long, Corte Madera and Ormondale students and staff enjoyed the new Music, Art, and Science rooms, the dedicated STEAM Lab, middle school atrium and classrooms, and the 4th and 5th grade building adjacent to the Town's "frog pond." The gardens and outdoor learning spaces on both campuses were a welcome addition.




MEASURE S PARCEL TAX

Parcel tax revenues account for approximately 5% of total District General Fund resources. The PVSD has one active parcel tax, approved by 75.1% of eligible voters on May 4, 2021, authorizing the District to levy a tax of \$471 per year on each real property parcel in the District. The term for this tax is eight years (sunsetting on June 30, 2029). Measure S funds are used to retain high-quality teachers, excellent programs, and maintain small class sizes. Both senior and disability exemptions are available to eligible residents.

The Portola Valley Parent Teacher Organization (PTO) raises money for school-specific events, initiatives, and classroom supplies. The PTO also organizes the many parent volunteers needed to run its programs and events. These volunteers are the heart of the Districts' character, and help create the welcoming sense of belonging that our students, staff, and families feel!

The Portola Valley Schools Foundation is a non-profit volunteer organization that provides private financial resources to the District. This generous support helps close the gap between public education funding, and the high-quality education desired by our community. The PVSF typically contributes between 5% and 7% of the District's annual \$18.2 million budget, supporting consistent, low student/teacher ratios, classroom aides, counselors at each school, music and art programs and so much more!

- 40 four-year old **Transitional Kindergarten (TK)** students and their families welcomed to the expanded TK program in August.
- A memorable **Ribbon Cutting** event to celebrate the completion of the bond construction projects was held on campus in October.
- Wonderful **PTO parent volunteers** support teachers and students in a variety of ways all year long, and are always welcome here!
- Award-winning school and campus **gardens**, planted by our students and Garden Guru during Garden Thyme, are blooming with flowers and vegetables thanks to a PVSF Endowment grant.
- Additional paraeducators joined the staff and work closely with teachers, supporting students academically at all grade levels.
- STEAM Lab open at recess and lunch for students, and a **STEAM** credentialed teacher provides weekly hands-on lessons and activities, encouraging creativity, curiosity, and critical thinking.
- New **after-school programs** introduced, including cooking, woodworking, chess, basketball, and a weekly Tinkering Club.
