### **Committee Reports -**

Athletic –Mary Jane Keller/Jim Brown/Ivan Hampton – Mr. Hampton reported. We held out Athletic Committee meeting on March 6<sup>th</sup> and what we discussed primarily was the achievement of some of our athletes over sports. We had two (2) WPIAL swimmers, Leilani Kunf and Emily Morrissey finished sixth place in the WPIAL qualifier. WPIAL gymnastics qualifier, Kayle McKelvey; WPIAL wrestling qualifier Alex Meadows, CJ Holloway and Carson Jones. Our boys' basketball team were section champs; won their first playoff game verses Armstrong, lost to Hampton in the second round. Our girls' basketball team finished second place in the conference. First playoff win verses Franklin Regional, lost to Hampton in the second round. They also discussed that we will be interviewing candidates for the cheerleading and dance team. Expectations will be addressed during the interview process. Mr. Brown – If I could just mention one thing. Coach Grayson was coach of the year in district five this year. First time ever.

Buildings & Grounds – Steve Kondrosky – Thank you very much Mr. President. We did meet this morning, Dr. Coughenour, Ed Fagan and myself at 7:30 AM. He gave us a list of things that were pretty substantial in making sure that the district runs smoothly. We replaced two gas modules and plungers at two of the four boilers at East End. I don't know why, we should get rid of that building. Sell that, do something with it. Repaired electrical ground fault at Twin Rivers. Level at the ground for no water retention in the vault. I am sure he logged that and Mr. Seropian, I'm sure you're going to add that to your list of items that were not completed properly under the contract and by the architect and the contractor for the building of the new school. Replaced bearing assembly in the uninvent in classroom 216 at Founders Hall. Rebuilt a motor and coil for uninvent in the child care at South Hall. They cleaned the water glycol coils on the boilers at Founders Hall. They did that in house and saved about \$600, kudos to them guys that know how to do this and really step up when we need them. Repaired right hand castable tile on the pool boiler at South Hall. I didn't know what they was, he explained it, it's lengthy and I forgot what he told me.

So, I'm not going to say anything. Painted rooms 171 and 173 at Twin Rivers for the community and school-based health team. A soothing therapy color was selected, this is phenomenal. You have to visit that to see what it's about. I was encouraged to hear how positive it was and the students and staff that were in there making sure that everything (end of the tape). Completed the annual inspection of operation and understructure of the telescopic bleachers at McClure, Twin Rivers and South Hall. That concludes everything that we have in the district because the other two were inspected earlier. That's required by international building code and international code compliance standard. We are beginning to prep baseball and softball fields weather permitting. Took the plows off and I think some of the salt spreaders which means that there is not going to be any more snow in their future; but, unfortunately I think they're going to be putting it back on. I think we got one more snow fall coming and that concludes my report. Thank you.

Career & Technology - Pat Maksin - We did meet on March 16<sup>th</sup>. There were a couple of things to bring to the public's attention. The culinary deck is in progress, it's ongoing. That will be a deck outside of the Tiger Inn. Our construction students have begun working on this and they have put down the foundation and so forth and weather permitting, that should be finished in May. It is sorely needed because of the huge success of the Tiger Inn. From what I gather, there is no room at the inn. Sometimes people come and the place is full. Once we get the deck out there it will help to alleviate some of the overcrowding and that's a wonderful problem to have. The library is also ongoing and the book shelving made by our building construction students will be put up. We are also ordering some plaques that will have the graduation years for the students who participated in building those shelving units so whenever they come back or their children come back years from now they will be able to see those shelving units were built in that particular year that we graduated. There is going to be a Perkins review on April 26, 27 and 28. The district will be ready for the review. For the Cinderella production that you saw a preview of tonight, our cosmetology students are doing the hair for Cinderella. Finally, the McKeesport 23, I want to bring that up again, that we will be having that dedication on Saturday, May 13<sup>th</sup>. It is a dedication of the monument memorial. Our students have dug the foundation for that memorial for them to get that into place. I assume that will be happening within the next couple of weeks, they will get that in That is the fallen Vietnam veterans, there are 23 from McKeesport that we will be honoring their names and the date that they died will be on the plaque. We will have that at the High School on Saturday, May 13<sup>th</sup>, at noon. We invite the public to please come to the auditorium. There will be a program and then we will proceed to the courtyard. That's where the plaque will be dedicated with everybody's name on it. There will be some light refreshments, so we invite the public. Make sure you spread the word. We would like to have a nice crowd to recognize those fallen 23. Thank you.

Community Relations/Cultural Diversity – Jim Brown/Ivan Hampton – Mr. Brown report. I met with our McKeesport African Coalition committee last week. There were some things that we discussed in our Cultural Diversity meeting today. One pretty much was how many applicants applied for the Superintendent's position, and that was told to us, 22. How many applicants will receive an interview, that was told to us 4. How many applicants applied for the position with no experience, that was one. How many applicants applied for the position of Superintendent that is holding Superintendent now, or Assistant Superintendent. I think it was two Superintendent and one Assistant Superintendent. Pretty much how many applicants are going to apply for the Assistant Superintendent and we have not yet discussed that as far as who is going to apply for Assistant. There was a person in the class today that said they had nine (9) years-experience and they were able to apply for the Superintendent job, but they just didn't feel like they were ready to apply. That's pretty much my report.

Education/Legislation/Policy - Mary Jane Keller/Mindy Sturgess - Mrs. Sturgess - on the Education Committee meeting, we met on March 15<sup>th</sup>. During that time, we discussed various course code revisions at the high school level for two main reasons. One, we want to offer our high school students more options in terms of course offerings and we also need to be cognizant of incoming students that are transitioning into the McKeesport Area School District. We want to make sure that when they enter they have the ability to match credit hours to fill the graduation requirements. I am happy to say that we will be adding I believe, five (5) new half credit courses at the high school. One will be reintroduction of college writing and composition. There will be an intro to music class being add, a lab, a business class as well as an intro to computer science. All of those will be one semester, half credit courses. During that meeting we also discussed the possibility of amending the science graduation We are looking at adding physical science, biology and chemistry as requirements for graduation. Right now many of our students don't take chemistry before they graduating high school here. So, that's something we are taking a look at. We also discussed the summer school which is the credit recovery for our high school students and that will be in conjunction with the YMCA like was done last year. There will be two sessions that will be running June 26 – July 17. Then again another session July 18 – August 3. That will enable students that need that credit recovery at a minimal cost to be able to achieve those Mrs. Keller – the Legislation Committee met on March 15<sup>th</sup>. Dr. Coughenour explained that the level 100 policies were last reviewed in 2007. Her advice was to begin reviewing and revising policies in that level. The following policies were started, that it #100, #105, #105.1. That is reflected In item #11 on tonight's Board agenda. That's my report.

Finance/Grants/Outside Funding – Scott Smith – The scheduled meeting last Wednesday was cancelled in lieu of Execution Session brought forward to discuss an impending Superintendent opening as we have all heard. I can tell you though we are continuing to work on the budget

for the 2017/2018 school year. There is still quite a bit, in my opinion, discrepancy between the revenues and the expenses unfortunately not in a good way. Naturally, the Administration will continue to work on that. That's my report.

Personnel – Mindy Sturgess/Steve Kondrosky – We met on Monday, March 6<sup>th</sup>. We actually moved our regularly scheduled personnel meeting to Monday so that more of our Board Members could attend with the discussion of the Superintendent vacancy and how we were going to proceed and move forward with the interview process. We also discussed the items and issues were requested on tonight's green sheets. That concludes my report.
