Committee Reports -

Athletic –Mary Jane Keller/Terri Kisan – Mrs. Keller reported. Our committee met on November 19th. There were two items that were of importance. One is the announcement that there will be a re-dedication of the Neenie Campbell gym. It will be on Tuesday, December 9th, but the time for it is yet to be determined. We will be meeting next week to decide that very early in the week. The second was the security now at Founders Hall and that is specifically in the front lobby. There may be a need with new locker rooms and all the new things that have been added to the gym that we may be adding something as far as security goes or more security. That's my report. Mrs. Kisan – If I can add in. The Spring sports have started. The basketball started for the 7th and 8th grade, the 9th grade teams and JV and the high school teams. Wrestling, swim team and basketball and as our Board President mentioned in her opening remarks we also want to congratulate the football team for making the final four in the quad A, WPIAL playoffs finishing with a record of 10-2.

Buildings & Grounds –Scott Smith – All facilities including the buildings we have decided not to reopen have all been winterized. In the high school the first set of restroom renovations, and by the way these are restroom renovations that our maintenance department is taking on themselves. Utilizing some of the materials that existed in some of those other buildings. It is almost complete. Founders Hall – we had a water leak down in the basement area where the football storage was. It has been there for years and part of this renovation, I've got to say, it appears as if that leak is now corrected and we haven't experienced any water down there for the last two weeks. Gym complete and being used by the basketball team for practice and we expect the locker rooms in there to be completed by 12/5 which is for the tip off tournament. White Oak, our boiler continues to fail, the maintenance department has done a great job at getting that boiler to start back up and function to make it through the season and I'm sure we're all interested in getting those students moved over into the new building as soon as we can. Windows leaking over there as well as the roof is leaking in a few small areas. Again, items that we don't necessarily want to address or put much money into. Finally, the work order system, they have completed 194 work orders this month. The last thing I want to bring up is a quick five number assessment of how the contract and how the change orders to date on the project has gone. Just as a reminder, the total contract amount was \$14,472,500. To date, total change orders is \$39,828. We had a 5% contingency which is standard for this type of project which would have been set aside \$723,625. To date, we have only used 6% of the contingency and the project is only approximately four to six weeks of being completed and the total change orders to date is only .275% of the contract value as opposed to the 5% we set aside. That completes my report.

Career & Technology – Terri Kisan – We did meet on October 21st. We were discussing the supplemental grant that was awarded and two items that technology was looking to purchase an air brush machine or an embroidery machine. We are still working on that. Our director did meet at a conference and she did listen to future funding for vocational programs and the new Governor to be, Tom Wolf, was there mentioning and discussing vocational programs for the future. Our students will be competing in Skills USA in three areas which will be plumbing, building and construction and cabinet making. Our students also serviced Kane hospital, we had 21 of our students service 31 folks at Kane Hospital for their hair. We also have Fridays in our cosmetology area open to the public. They are willing to take groups in or on an individual basis. That's on Fridays. They are open to the public. Also, our Allied Health students participated in a community service at Riverside where they were giving out 53 flu vaccines and they also participated with a blood drive. Also commercial arts, they have holiday options which are engraving, they do t-shirts and they do bracelets. Out culinary is selling Christmas cookies, it was mentioned in the newspaper in the article, they are doing 5 dozen cookies on a tray for \$25 so you can place your orders if you are interested up until December 12th. They will be participating in the Festival of Trees which is December 4th. Our culinary students will be making some food to be served there. If I could on a separate note, just say something that I'm thankful for. I do have Tammi from Nutrition, Inc. in the audience. Tammi, I do want to thank you for all of the meals that have been serving all of our students at no cost to them. You have been serving breakfasts, you have been serving lunches and the new add on with the PAWS students that are at Twin Rivers, Francis McClure and Founders Hall, you are feeding all of them dinner and before they get on the bus you give them a nice snack. Whether the ceilings are falling, your gals and your workers find a way to accommodate and you're making sure all of these kids are getting three meals and their snacks. They are here until 6, 7, 8 o'clock and you're doing an amazing job and I just wanted to thank you. That's all Madame President.

Community Relations/Cultural Diversity –Trisha Gadson – Madame President, we met today at 4:00 PM for our regular meeting. During the first part of the meeting we discussed a community action plan that came out of a community meeting that the school district participated in. As a result of that there were several steps identified on how to prevent any future confrontation amongst teenagers with regards to inappropriate use of the internet. As a result Dr. Skezas announced that Phillip Little from the District Attorney's office will be presenting to parents on December 3rd at the Twin Rivers Community Room on this topic. So, all parents in the district are welcome to attend that event. Also discussed during a portion of that meeting was a Life skills retreat at which community mentors will be brought together to encourage young people to interact with one another and to build more positive conflict resolution skills. That will happen some time in the Spring of 2015. We then moved on to sub-committee reports at which time Pastor Coleman reported on the faith-based Regular

sub-committee and talked about the angel tree activities that the Twin Rivers students participated in. The training sub-committee report was given by Mary Jane Keller who talked about the review of survey results from the poverty simulation that district staff participated in as a result of the comments made in the pre and post surveys there will be a transfer of learning activity implemented in the Spring of 2015. The Family and Community Engagement sub-committee is my committee. I indicated that the next community meeting that I will attend will be the Dravosburg Council Meeting in December and also under that committee we discussed the fact that the YSD sub-contractor that we work with is continuing to work with and support the work of the teacher empowerment grant to improve African American student presence in advanced placement classes. There was no report by the No One Is Alone Club; however, I am aware that they are continuing to meet and continuing to prepare the students for activities to presentations for 8th graders in the Spring. The last report was given by Dr. Bauman on behalf of him and Dr. Skezas in the hiring and retention sub-committee in which they discussed a program that is being offered by the district in partnership with California University of Pennsylvania to encourage existing employees who have degrees to obtain their certification in teaching so that we can retain the invested folks in our district and also make an effort to increase minority representation in the classroom. To take a page out of Mrs. Kisan's book, I would like to end my report by saying that I am thankful for all of the partners who work on this committee, particularly Dr. Bauman who did a tremendous job in researching the partnership program with California University. A lot has been done under this committee and it could not have been done if we did not roll up our sleeves and work collaboratively. That ends my report.

Education/Legislation/Policy – Mary Jane Keller – My committee met on November 19th. We had a presentation by Jennifer Knight on the envision math program which is a new math program being used in our elementary schools. She reported that three kindergarten classes invited their parents to visit the school and that they had a presentation on one lesson from their new math program. Her goal for the rest of the year in grades K-5 is to invite parents to come from all the schools through the next few months to answer question about new math and they would certainly see a new math lesson presented to them. She reported that our 6th grade has tutoring in place for all the grades and that K-5 at Twin Rivers the primary has two tutors that are helping them. Last thing was we are concerned about the transitioning from science in the middle school to their move to the high school. So, we are looking to the AIU to help us and give us suggestions about how best to do that. As far as Legislation and Policy we also met on November 19th first was the Policies that were presented for the first reading tonight that is policy 701 through 706. Next policy 830 is a policy that is for a breach of computerized personal information and we need to have that in our policy manual. Last was 707 which was reviewed and examined, no changes were made and this is the one that has to do with the use of facilities and the rental of them and the solution too is that if a group has any

difficulties or experiences any difficulties, they can certainly refer to Mr. Seropian who would be more than willing to help them out. Thank you, that is my report.

Finance/Grants/Outside Funding—Tom Maglicco — Yes, Madame President we did meet and our topic of discussion was our Annual Financial Report that puts the fund balance at \$4.4 million. Last year we used \$3.3 million from our fund balance. This is a concern. After the committee spoke to the Administration, they assured us that the budget is trending to use only about half of the fund balance that we budgeted for the 2014/2015 school year. Moving forward, the Administration and the School Board will continue to look at ways to save monies throughout the district. The early retirement incentive is one way the district will save money by reducing our overall cost in the 2015/2016 school year budget. That concludes my report and do you have any outside grants, Dr. Skezas?

Dr. Skezas – I can mention two that I shared, one was the School Resource Officer grant that we received a \$60,000 grant that will be implementation for the 2015/2016 school year. Also, we just received word that we did receive a \$16,000 some dollars in a safe schools that the purpose of that is because our Founders Hall is utilized so much, we going to have some pull down gates so that when outside community members come in or people that use our buildings, we can close off various sections of the building so that our teachers' classrooms would be safe and secure. I do have to say Dr. Chapman and her committee has done an outstanding job with the grants and we're real happy for receive them both.

Personnel –Joe Lopretto/Tom Maglicco – Mr. Lopretto reported. We did have a meeting and the green sheets reflect all that. Again, if it wasn't for Dr. Bauman, Dr. Skezas and Mr. Humanic working hard, diligently, getting the right people in the right places, things wouldn't work out, but the green sheet works out well for us and I appreciate everything you guys do. Safe Schools - Joe Lopretto – No we didn't have a meeting, but we are having a meeting on Tuesday, December 2nd.

Mrs. Maksin – I would like to say that I am thankful for each one of you who serve on committees and committee chairs that you can tell from our reports, there is a lot of work that goes on here and I'm grateful and thankful to each one of you for all the hard work that you bring to this group each month.

Mrs. Kisan – Madame President, I have one more update to my Athletic Committee report, this evening's final score in the Powder Puff game was Seniors 7 and Juniors 0.
