
CHERRY LANE ELEMENTARY SCHOOL - NEW YORK STATE REPORT CARD [2022 - 23]








Percent Scoring at Levels for All Students



Percent Scoring at Levels for All Students











NEW YORK STATE ENGLISH AS A SECOND LANGUAGE ACHIEVEMENT TEST (2022-23)

New York State English as a Second Language Achievement Tests (NYSESLAT) are administered in grades K through 12 to all English Language Learners (ELLs). ELLs are students who, by reason of foreign birth or ancestry, speak or understand a language other than English and speak or understand little or no English, and require support to become proficient in English and are identified pursuant to Section 154.3 of Commissioner's Regulations.




