Fiber Asset – Benefit to Schools

- ACCESS “Other” Bundled Services:
 - Student Information System - For grade reporting, transcripts, scheduling, attendance, disciplinary action, special education forms, and all areas of EMIS reporting.
 - USAS/USPS - A state written accounting and payroll package that meets state standards.
 - INFOhio - Statewide automated library system for the K-12 levels, which includes a statewide Union Catalog listing all materials found in any INFOhio library, as well as Audio Visual materials, Special Education materials, Community Resource Records) listing areas of interest around the state), Venture Capital Records, and the ability “book” these items.
 - E-Mail - Address and mailbox for all students, teachers, and staff, including all management tools
- **Cost for “Other” Bundled Services: \$9.95 per ADM**

ITC Comparison – Per ADM

Student Information, Fiscal, Special Ed, INFOhio, and Email

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Management Council/ITC Update

- **Management Council/ITC - Student Information (DASL) interest sold to Software Answers for \$8 million.**
 - **Reserved \$475,000 (for 3 years)** for the hire of a **Chief Information Security Office (CSCO)** to be employed to work with all 18 ITCs to assure that the ITCs are prepared, as much as possible, to address Cyber Security and Cyber Liability threats.
 - **Reserved \$280,000 (for two years)** earmarked for the **Data Interchange Project** development utilizing Jitterbit software to allow third-party vendors to engage in communication with Student Information and Fiscal products.
 - Distribute the remaining balance to ITCs directly based on the number of years the Student Information System was utilized by the ITC.
 - Range distributed to ITCs: \$46,000 – \$1,695,000.00.
 - **ACCESS portion received from 2001-2018 - \$208.896.00**
 - (ACCESS utilized ESIS instead for several years.)

ACCESS SERVICES UPDATES

- **Fiber Update – Current Projects**
 - Reroute of Wick Avenue/YSU fiber – Aerial to Underground – Beautification Project - **Completed**
 - Michael Kusalaba/West Library – Fiber Reroute to new building - **Completed**
 - Geospatial Underground Fiber Location Project – USIC Locating - **Completed**
 - Reroute of Route 172 fiber – Ohio Edison - **Ongoing**
 - Horizon Overlash Project - **Ongoing**
 - ODOT Construction Projects – Culvert repairs, etc. - **Ongoing**
 - Pole Transfers – Storms, constructions, etc. - **Ongoing**
- **The Fiber Plant provides services to...**
 - Schools, libraries, hospitals, police departments, municipalities and local businesses.



NETWORK SERVICES

VoIP Infrastructure

- 16 locations – Voice and TEC features
East Palestine and Youngstown Community planning to onboard
Summer 2018
- ACCESS service cost reduction (from \$70 to \$55 per device) We hope to continue to decrease based on participation.

ACCESS Service Alerts

- Text Message Alerts – to announce unexpected outages, etc. that affect our services to you.

Web Filtering – Network Advisory Committee

- Securly – Web-based cloud filter with risk assessment monitoring available.

FISCAL SERVICES

2017-2018 focus has been on the SSDT redesign software

Test instances in place or in progress

Advisory Committee work

- Working since February 2018 to test out the software
- Identifying bugs and needed fixes/modifications
- Assisting in identifying when a comfort level is reached to begin migrating districts
- Will be leaned upon to help develop training once migrations begin

Time line

Redesign trainings to begin being offered to develop comfort level for district staff

Potential for 2 districts to migrate by December 2018 if comfort level exists

District migrations will be ongoing quarterly with several migrating at a time

Current estimate is that all districts will be migrated by the end of 2021
