**MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING
PETTIS COUNTY CHILDREN'S DIVISION AND
SEDALIA SCHOOL DISTRICT**

The *Every Student Succeeds Act of 2015* (ESSA) requires that school districts and child welfare agencies collaborate to develop and implement clear written procedures governing how transportation will be provided, arranged, and funded to maintain children in foster care in their school of origin during the time students are in foster care when it is in their best interest.

Sequence:

1. When a student is placed in foster care or changes residence while in foster care, the local Children's Division Worker must notify Dr. Nancy Scott, the School District's Foster Care Liaison within 72 hours of the placement change. If the new residence is not in the same school or school district, the Foster Care Liaisons from both the school of origin and the school of residence district must be notified and invited to participate in the Best Interest Determination meeting.

2. The local Children's Division worker, Foster Care Liaisons, and other essential members participating in the Best Interest Determination (BID) share their information, including transportation options. Multiple factors should be considered and addressed in the BID. Transportation options considerations for foster care students should include: safety for the student and other students being transported; student age; length of commute; and, distance. The BID should be comprehensive and include consideration of cost-effective measures.

3. If the Best Interest Determination decision is that the student will remain in the current school, the Foster Care Liaison notifies the school of origin transportation designee, who then assists the Children's Division worker in arranging transportation to and from school.

Options:

The following options will be considered to provide school of origin transportation:

1. An existing bus route can be used.
2. An existing bus route can be modified slightly to accommodate the new address.
3. The local taxi service, ETS, can be utilized.
4. The local Children's Division worker should explore options outside of those provided by the school district, such as reimbursing the foster parents for

transportation costs or by contracting transportation with licensed child-placement agencies or group homes.

5. The Sedalia #200 School District will split the additional cost with the school of residence (or school of origin if the student is residing in Pettis County) and the Children's Division.

Funding:

1. If the student has an IEP that includes provisions for specialized transportation, transportation must be provided by the school district responsible for the student's Free Appropriate Public Education (FAPE).
2. If the Sedalia #200 School District can offer an existing means of transportation at no additional cost, the local Children's Division will not be charged.
3. If the Sedalia #200 School District can provide transportation but will need to modify a route or create a new option, the school of origin transportation designee will calculate the cost that will be charged to the local Children's Division.

We received bids from KAT Excavation, Inc., B & P Excavating, Don Schnieders Excavating Co., Inc., and Jeff Schnieders Construction Co.

The low bid received was from KAT Excavation, of Bates City, MO in the amount of \$645,209.00. B & P Excavating of Sedalia, MO. Bid amount is \$648,614.00. My recommendation is to accept the local bid from B & P Excavating for \$648,614.00 which is \$3,405.00 or approximately 0.5% more than KAT.

Discussion:

The two low bidders are good contractors. We have talked with all the bidders. The two low bidders both indicated that they have the complete scope of work. We discussed with KAT Excavation that the District does have a local preference policy, if desired by the District, for bids within a few percent. KAT stated he has several employees that live in the Sedalia area and that KAT has done a lot of work for Sedalia 200 at SCHS. Kat would like to continue this relationship with the District with their low bid. Septagon recommends we proceed with Alternate 2 - Geotech Fabric under all Temporary rock. This is to be placed before winter. Unit Pricing and Alternate #1 will slightly change the percentage comparison of the two low bidders. In general, KAT is 0.5% to 1% lower than B & P. Our estimate for this Civil Package was \$775,000. So either of the low two are well below the estimate.

RE: West Central Special Education Cooperative

Several years ago Dr. Spence and I wrote a grant to start a cooperative with the other Pettis County schools in order to be able to hire full time therapists for special education. At the present time we have a total of 11 schools that participate. We, being the largest school, are the fiscal agent. At the time it was started we used some of the services through the cooperative. Since nine years ago, we have not really used anything from the cooperative, but have been paying the fee to belong. The fee is based on the child count in the area of special education. For Sedalia #200 the yearly fee is between \$8,500 and \$12,750 depending on our count.

I am requesting that the Board approve Sedalia #200 withdraw membership with the cooperative due to the cooperative not being a benefit for Sedalia #200, but costing to stay in it.

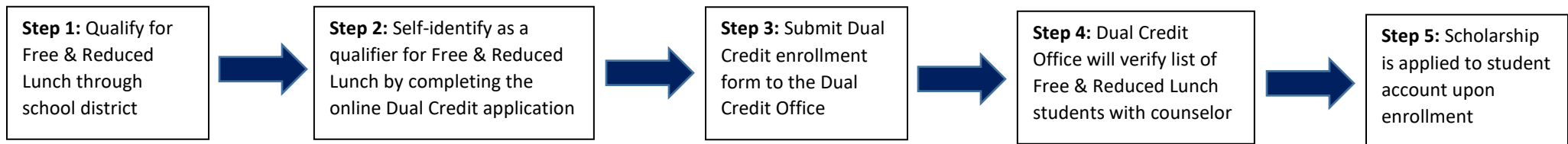

Dual Credit Free and Reduced Lunch Process

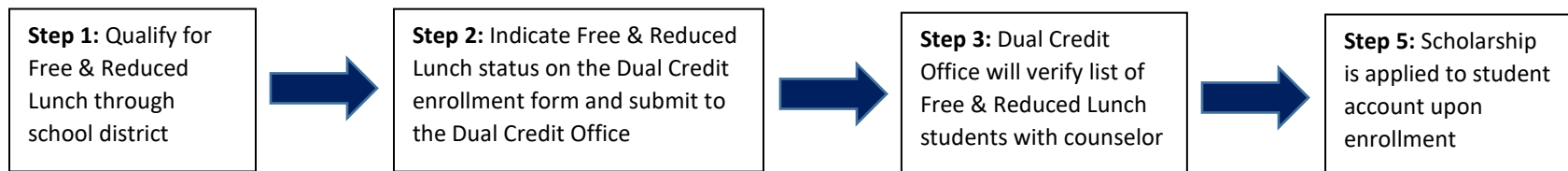
State Fair Community College is now offering free Dual Credit tuition for students who qualify for Free and Reduced Lunch through their school district. Students who qualify have the opportunity to earn free tuition for both on-ground and online Dual Credit classes starting in Spring 2020. This scholarship will not cover textbook or additional course fees.

State Fair Community College will also continue to provide school districts with Dual Credit scholarships each year based on the total number of credit hours enrolled from the Fall, Spring, and Summer terms of the prior academic year. Schools will receive scholarships based on 5 percent of their total number of credit hours enrolled. These scholarships are to be used within the academic year in which they are distributed can be used during the Fall, Spring, or Summer terms.
