RENEWAL OF OPERATING MILLAGE

On May 8, 2018, a special election will be held. Byron Area Schools will ask voters to **RENEW** the existing operating millage that was successfully passed in 2012.

THIS IS NOT A NEW TAX | It is a Renewal
0% ZERO TAX RATE INCREASE

Facts

In 1994, Proposal A significantly reformed and reduced taxes for school operations in Michigan.

Proposal A requires school districts to levy 18 mills on non-homestead property **ONLY**.

These funds are used for classroom instruction and programs and to operate the school district.

Primary residences, qualified agricultural property and qualified forestry property are not subject to the 18 mills.

Creating an environment that nurtures the value of education.

- ✓ This proposal will allow the school district to **continue** to levy the statutory rate of not to exceed 18 mills on all property, except principal residence and other property exempted by law, required for the school district to receive its revenue per pupil foundation allowance and restores millage lost as a result of the reduction required by the Michigan Constitution of 1963.
