

Benjamin Franklin High School - Discipline Matrix (Grades 7-12)

The Benjamin Franklin Charter School Discipline Matrix is a discipline guide for campus administrators. The administrators utilize this tool as a guide for student corrective action. Administrators have the discretion to assign appropriate corrective actions as they see fit and on a case-by-case basis. Chronic "no-shows" to detention will result in an in-school suspension. Failure to complete assigned corrective actions may result in out-of-school suspension or recommendation for expulsion.

Possession and/or use of tobacco The possession, use, distribution, or sale of tobacco products (including electronic cigarettes, vape pens, JUULing paraphernalia, etc.) on school grounds, at school-sponsored events, and on school transportation. A person who knowingly sells, gives, or furnishes cigars, cigarettes or cigarette papers, smoking or chewing tobacco, to a minor, and a minor who buys, or has in his possession or knowingly accepts or receives from any person, cigars, cigarettes or cigarette papers, smoking or chewing tobacco of any kind, is guilty of a petty offense. It can include unwelcome sexual advances, requests for sexual favors, and other verbal, nonverbal, or physical conduct of a sexual nature. - Relevant factors in determining whether behavior rises to the level of sexual harassment include: The degree to which the conduct affected one or more students' education, type, frequency, and duration of the conduct, identity of and relationship between the alleged harasser and the subject or subjects of the harassment, the number of individuals involved, the age and sex of the alleged harasser and the subject or subject or subjects of the harassment, the size of the school, location of the incidents, and the context in which they occurred, and/or other incidents at the school. Making a school threat that might reasonably lead to the evacuation or closure of school property or to the postponement, cancellation, or suspension of any class or other school activity (through actual evacuation, closure, postponement, cancellation, or suspension is not required). Includes verbal school threats, written school threats, threatening to cause harm by using or threatening to use a bomb, or arson-causing device, and/or threatening to cause harm using dangerous chemicals or biological agents.
