Dear North Tonawanda City School District Parents,

On September 6, 2016 New York State passed a law (NYCRR Title 10, Subpart 67-4) requiring public school districts to test their water outlets for lead contamination and to implement a lead remediation plan where necessary.

In compliance with this new legislation, the North Tonawanda City School District has completed water testing at all of our schools and buildings. The water sampling and reports were conducted by Stohl Environmental, a New York State Environmental Consultant. We have sampled over 600 water outlets across the North Tonawanda City School District. The district has received the results which are reported on the district website. Reports have been posted for Drake Elementary School, Ohio Elementary School, Spruce Elementary School, North Tonawanda Intermediate School, North Tonawanda Middle School, and North Tonawanda High School.

An outlet is a potable (safe to drink/drinkable) water fixture that is currently or potentially used for drinking or cooking purposes, including but not limited to drinking fountains, bubblers, and faucet/fixture.

Any water outlet that exceeds the state's action level of 15 ppb (parts per billion) will immediately be discontinued for use as a potable drinking water outlet. The outlet will either be taken out of service or have appropriate signage posted stating 'Non-potable Water – Do Not Drink'. A remediation plan will then be developed for these outlets which may include filtration, replacement or removal. The outlet will be retested to insure levels are below thresholds before being used as potable water again.

Action Steps Being Taken in the North Tonawanda City School District

- Outlets that exceed the 15 ppb threshold are either taken out of service or appropriate signage posted.
- The district is currently working to identify the specific source of the impurity.
- Remedial action will take place once the source is identified.
- Follow-up testing will be conducted as required by the regulations.
