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## Message from Superintendent



It is hard to believe another school year has come and gone. It is even harder to believe that this year's 2016 Kindergarten class will be the graduating class of 2029. We wish our 2016 graduates all the best as they go out and start on the path of becoming adults. Parents and grandparents can tell you that life is hard at times but having a strong core and center of home and family can help in even the hardest of times. We hope North Tonawanda will always be a place you fondly remember as home no matter where life takes you.

Looking forward to the 2016-2017 school year we are excited for a number of new initiatives that will help future North Tonawanda graduates be well prepared for the world around them when they are not in school. In June we offered incoming kindergarten students the option of borrowing an iPad with math and English apps on them to help them get a jump start on the basics that they will need in Kindergarten. This fall the district will begin a secondary 1 to 1 initiative involving select teachers who will start the movement to present, share, and instruct with the use of iPads. Students in these teachers' classes will be among the first to receive a district issued iPad so that everyone has the same platform from which to work. The plan is to expand this yearly until all students in grades 7-12 have a device. We will continue to expand the iPad elementary program working our way back through the grade levels until everyone has a class set. Currently each teacher has ten to use as a mini station. Some students at the high school will also see a math lab on their schedule this fall. This will provide more time to master math skills which will help students understand what they are being taught.

The 2016 -2017 school year will also be the start of the capital project that will reconfigure Meadow Elementary into the North Tonawanda Middle School. Construction is scheduled to start in the spring of 2017. In addition to the building work, fields and wireless connectivity will be addressed in most of the buildings, as well as, security upgrades.

So while it is with heavy hearts we say good-bye to our graduating seniors and over 30 fulltime staff who have retired, we are also excited to see smiling faces return in September with a number of exciting educational changes that will help us better prepare for the future.

**Volunteer Experiences:** A memorable volunteer experience for me was volunteering for open house. Helping parents find their way in a building I know well made me feel useful and happy.


**Proudest Accomplishments:** My proudest accomplishment is becoming an administrator of an online forum with an international community.

# North Tonawanda Art Project Receives Grant for Starry Night Interpretation

North Tonawanda Art teacher Melinda Wright was excited when she heard her Meadow class had received a grant from The Remember Ryan Foundation. The foundation awards competitive visual and performing arts mini-grants to public and private elementary schools.

Inspired by Vincent Van Gogh’s masterpiece Starry Night, she proposed that she and the students from Mrs. Kendt’s MPP class would incorporate STEAM (Science, Technology, Engineering, Art and Math) into their own piece of art. “For science we had the students study constellations. For technology and engineering we made LED lights for the piece with homemade batteries. For the math part the students made a grid of the night sky and of course for art, Starry Night was our inspiration,” says Ms. Wright. “We wanted to do something new and innovative that will go beyond regular classroom activities.”



## North Tonawanda CSD Rolls Out iPad Loan to Pre-Kindergarten Students

Next year's kindergarten class is getting a jumpstart on learning thanks to an innovative program that the North Tonawanda School District is rolling out this school year. The district is loaning out iPads over the summer to future kindergartners that have been loaded with eight apps: Starfall ABCs, ABC Ninja, Alphabet Sounds, ABC Magic Phonics 5, Fine Motor Fundamentals, Writing Wizard, Bugs and Numbers and 123 Ninja. The internet and camera have been disabled on the devices so they are used as a learning tool only. When school starts, they will be permanently housed at the children's schools.

Superintendent Greg Woytila says he had heard about a similar program in Lockport City School District and thought it was a great idea as it gets the children practicing math and reading on those rainy days or long car trips during the summer. "I shared the idea with our kindergarten teachers to help the students to start off on the right foot. We felt it was very important and our hope is that with the extra practice, our future graduates of 2030 will be well-prepared to start school in September and finish strong."

Kindergarten teacher Suzanne Nyitrai says the teachers think this is a great initiative. "Mr. Woytila asked for our input on what apps should be preloaded to help get our students get ready for the upcoming school year. We thought a perfect time to give them out to parents would be during our May kindergarten screening. The parents were given a tote bag with the device, a charger, and information on the apps, a coloring book and crayons." Parents agree to a \$100 deductible if the device is lost, stolen or damaged.

The screenings took place at Grant Street School, where the future students were assessed for their readiness for school. "We have them identify capital letters and numbers, count from one to thirty, write their name, cut on a line and test their cognitive, verbal, fine and gross motor skills and visual memory," explains Ms. Nyitrai. "We also have a nurse test their vision and hearing. It helps us to determine if the student will need remediation once they start school and potentially allow us to work with them over the summer. It is also a great way for us to meet the parents as well."

Ms. Nyitrai says the screening is very important and urges all parents with incoming kindergartners to set up a time for it. "It gives us a snapshot of the skills they have and helps us to put a plan in place for their education." The next screening will be on August 30th at Spruce School.
