COVID-19 Update

Lincoln Academy

- There were no positive COVID cases reported to the school from staff and students from December 3rd through January 1st. JCPH is processing this information and as a result, Grades 5-8 will no longer be in Outbreak status.
- As has always been our priority this year, we will continue to do everything possible to keep our students in school while also keeping our school safe. We have developed a solid plan to cover multiple unfilled teacher absences in order to prioritize in person learning for all students. However, as COVID numbers continue to rise through the new variant, we do need to be prepared and ready for possible transitions to short periods of remote learning. This would be a last resort due to a significant number of positive COVID cases including sick staff having to isolate until they recover. Depending on the health of the staff, the availability of substitutes, the timeframe of potential classroom closures, the grade level and complexity of work missed, this may look like synchronous remote learning or like asynchronous packet work. We would try to give you as much notice as possible if any classrooms or grade levels must transition to a short period of remote learning as a last resort.

MATH According to the 2021-2024 Lincoln Academy Strategic Plan, when compared to the previous year data for math, each grade-level will show an increase of 2-3 median growth percentiles with a minimum median growth percentile of 55.

- In 3 out of 7 grades, the median growth percentile and minimum median growth percentile are on pace to achieve the goals set for this year.
- In 6 out of 7 grades, the observed growth is higher than the grade-level norm projected growth between the fall and winter assessments. Last school year from fall to spring, the observed growth was higher in 5 out of 7 grades.
- Most notable growth increases from last school year to this school year:
3rd Grade 49 to 71; 8th Grade 47 to 70
- Teachers are beginning to analyze the skills in which students struggled and are crafting strategies to address through the rest of the school year.
