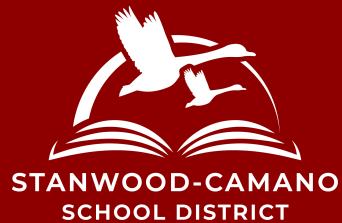

## Educational Equity

We as a district will place equity at the center of all decision making and planning, ensuring that all students and staff have a voice and the resources they need to thrive academically, socially and emotionally in our schools.

# Legislative Impacts

HB 1238 was signed into law May 9, 2023

- Any elementary school with free and reduced at 40% this year and 30% next year would have free meals for students in that school.

What this means for Stanwood-Camano:

- 2023-24: We do not have any elementary schools that reached 40% free and reduced
- 2024-25: We may have some schools that reach 30% free and reduced

We will have a good idea at the end of October what the Free and Reduced percentages will be for next year. This will be updated in the February report.

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# Health and Wellness Committee

The committee will meet three times this year to review the procedures:

- October 25
- February 28
- May 29

Some highlights for our committee implementation plan this year:

- Review health learning standards with the teaching and learning department
- Explore professional development for staff to promote healthy behaviors for students
- Establish a team to review practices on snacks at elementary schools

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# Meals served this summer

Total Breakfasts: **1,131**

Total Lunches: **2,270**

- Eligible sites were Twin City Elementary and Stanwood High School
- All children aged 18 and under received free meals

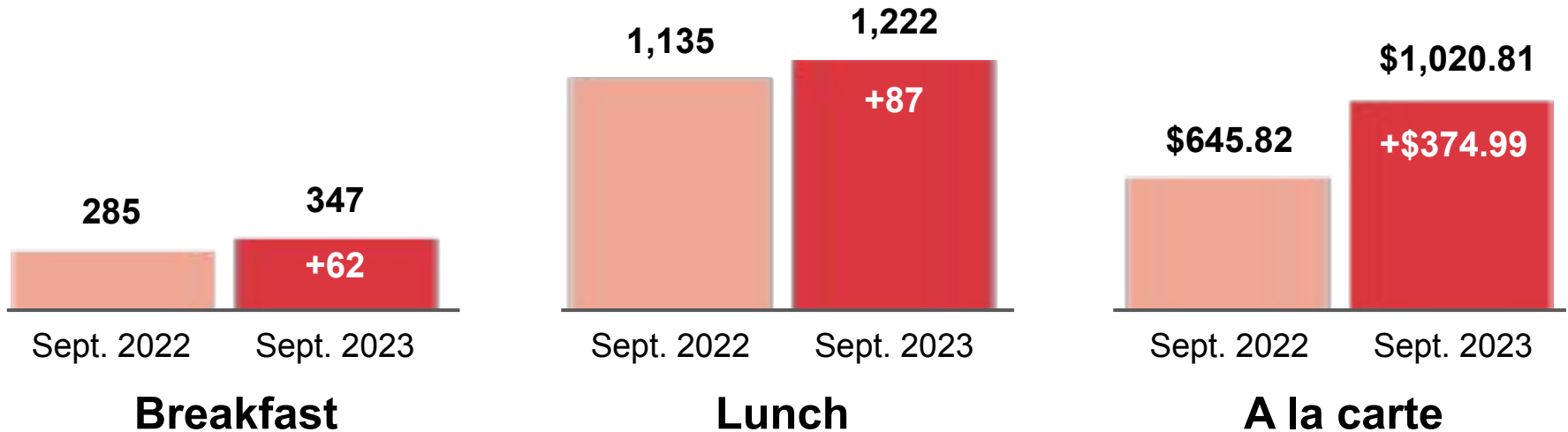
## Summer EBT

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# Food Service Wrap Up

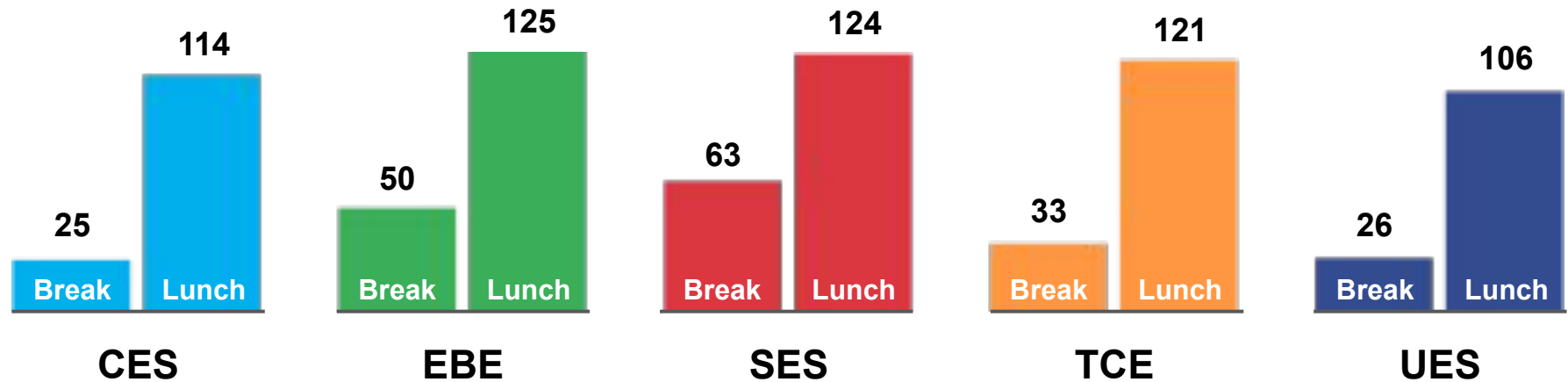
We have started this year with higher daily average participation numbers compared to last year
