 acquisition of property for future schools.



 - Please bring your student as we will have donuts and a fun time together


Entry Control System

System Procedures:

- Visitors must sign in and wear a badge or visitor sticker while in the building

- It helps us better maintain knowledge of persons entering the building




Attendance

- Communicate with the school if your child will be absent
 - Call the Safe Arrival Line for illness/doctor's appointments
 - O Fill out a "Preapproved Absence Request Form" for vacations
 - Located online and in the school office
 - Allows the school to excuse absences (if your student is not chronically absent)



Parking Lot Safety

- Please pull forward in the drive thru lane
- Please have your child exit via the passenger door

Arrival/Dismissal

 <u>Bicycles</u>: Students are required to walk their bicycles when on campus, including to/from the 4-corners intersection



 Pets: Dogs and other pets are not allowed on campus



 <u>Firelane</u>: Please park in designated 5 minute stalls when picking up your student during school hours



 <u>Drive Safe</u>: Drive slow, watch for walkers, and follow crossing guard directions


