The continued notification to stakeholder groups regarding FID program implementation was done during the 2024-25 school calendar approval process. During the presentation to the Board of School Directors, the intention to continue to request Flexible Instructional Days was explained. Student handbooks all contain FID Day instructions and explain that after one true snow day, when conditions do not allow for safe in-person instruction, the district will designate a Virtual Learning Day. All students will utilize their district- issued devices for at-home learning during Virtual Learning Days. Students will begin their school days at the normal time with elementary students logging in to Seesaw for their schedule and Zoom information and secondary students accessing Zoom Homeroom for instruction and/or assignments. On Virtual Learning Days, all extra-curricular activities will be canceled. Stakeholders will be notified that a FID will be implemented using our district mass communication system, Blackboard. This is the same procedure that we have used for the last several years to notify families about schedule changes due to weather impacts. Families would receive a text, an email and a phone call; staff would receive a text, email, and phone call. As is currently the procedure for potential remote learning days, Administrators would inform teachers who would in turn inform students to take home supplies and materials "just-in-case" they will be needed for a FID Day. The primary means by which DTSD will announce schedule change information include an automated messaging system (phone and/or text), the website and district social media feeds. School schedule change information is also shared with a variety of local media outlets as a courtesy. Please note, however, all decisions regarding if and how this information is then used are at the sole discretion of each individual outlet and not Derry Township School District. Sample Administration/Staff Message: Earlier this evening, I made the decision to shut down the campus tomorrow due to the potential for heavy snowfall. Below is some additional information to help clarify work expectations. Support Staff All full-time and Level D employees should not report to campus if they are able to telework. Full-time or Level D employees who are unable to telework may use accrued vacation or emergency leave or choose not to be compensated. Additionally, full-time or Level D employees who do not work should enter leave into SAMS. Custodial and

maintenance personnel shall work unless otherwise directed by their supervisor. Level A, B, or C employees should not report to campus tomorrow. Level A, B or C employees who the district identifies as being able to telework should work remotely tomorrow. Level A, B, or C employees who are unable to telework (see below) but wish to be compensated, may use accrued personal or emergency leave. Additionally, Level A, B and C employees who cannot telework but wish to be compensated should enter leave into SAMS. The district has identified the following employee groups as unable to telework during Virtual Learning Day/Flexible Instructional Days. Bus Driver Cafeteria/Recess Aide Classroom Assistant Food Service Worker Intervention Support Aide Library Aide Nursing Assistant/RN Study Hall Monitor Professional and Administrative Staff All professional and administrative staff should not report to campus but work remotely instead. Sample Student/Family Message: Here is the script of a Flexible Instruction Day phone call and email sent to families via One Call Now: Due to inclement travel conditions, there will be no in-person instruction at Derry Township School District today. Instead, today will be a Flexible Learning Day. Students should begin their school days at the normal time with secondary students logging in to their Zoom Homeroom and elementary students accessing Seesaw for their schedule and Zoom information. All extracurricular activities scheduled for today are cancelled. Here's what we would post for weather related Flexible Learning Days on our website and social media: Due to inclement travel conditions, there will be no in-person instruction at Derry Township School District Friday, (date). Instead, the day will be a Flexible Instruction Day. All classes will be virtual. Students should begin their school day at the normal time with secondary students logging in to their Zoom Homeroom and elementary students accessing Seesaw. All extracurricular activities are cancelled, and the campus is closed.

Canvas LMS will be the primary means for asynchronous content delivery. Each day will allow for two core subjects and two related arts subjects as well as zoom office hours. Instruction is not to exceed 5 hours per day. Teachers are to focus upon and grade essential learning items only. High School: Teachers will collaborate with PLC's, department members, special education and ELD teachers to set up online lessons for students. Canvas LMS will be the primary means for asynchronous content delivery. Time will be provided for up to 5 academic subjects and 1 hour of dedicated office hours via zoom. The students in Derry Township School District are 1:1 with iPads K-12 beginning the 2020-21 school year. Students will be issued school devices and materials during the first week of school in August 2021. This deployment is standard procedure, and many secondary students will have maintained their device from the 2020-21 school year. The district has contacted families who may have limited access to the internet and has worked to improve our plan by using Verizon Sim cards. This option does not currently provide families with unlimited data so there is a push to educate students and their families that these resources are to be used for school activities only. Special Education Considerations: 1. We will have special education teachers and related service providers to directly provide services to families including live streaming for small group instruction where feasible and teletherapy as appropriate to the needs of each student. Very specific directions have been shared as demonstrated by this Elementary example: Special Education teachers will use the Distance Learning- Teacher Weekly Agenda Template- Special Education to complete their individual lesson plan and provide instructional activities for their instructional groups identifying a weekly focus for each area. The teacher will link their agenda into the Building Special Education document that will be shared with parents. Example of Building Document: Special Education K-1 Learning Agenda- Week of March 30th Digital Agenda TemplateFolders - Examples for teacher weekly agendas Special education teachers will collaborate with the grade level teachers in planning for students receiving instruction in the regular education classroom. Special education teachers should utilize zoom office hours (see schedule below) and share the meeting link with their students to be available for additional support. 2. All students K-12 are issued an iPad at the beginning of the year. Teachers maintain SeeSaw (for elementary) and Canvas (for secondary) course pages for student assignments and activities. Teachers would push out their lessons via these platforms and would provide "office hours" to assist students with any difficulties. All students have access to technology resources -

families without internet are provided with Verizon hot spots or assisted in acquiring discount internet services. Our students and families are used to both LMS platforms and are skilled with their use. In addition, we use the Zoom platform for live synchronous instruction. This allows the teacher to provide a balance of live instruction and asynchronous work for the students when delivering content on the FID Day. Materials and resources will be relevant because they will be a continuation of the week's lessons in the Learning Management System as listed above. Teachers will provide opportunities for both synchronous streaming of their instruction via zoom and asynchronous access to content, depending on which is most appropriate for the content and their instructional objectives. The teachers and students are quite adept and used to delivering and accessing their instructional content via our learning management systems. Teachers often will provide screencasts and tutorials for students to view if they are not able to be face to face, or synchronous, for instruction. Should the school closure be due to a storm of the nature that power outages would be expected (such as a severe ice storm), school would be closed and a scheduled school make-up day would be used instead of a FID day.

Some of the assigned learning tasks will give specific deadlines, and some will give students flexible deadlines and flexible options for participation. These should be read carefully. Classes will be meeting in "real-time"

every day, and teachers will be available each week during virtual office hours to answer questions or for extra support. Students should seek to take advantage of these opportunities for extra help. Always double-check Announcements for each course. Don't rely on the Canvas To-Do list as not all activities, readings, and resources are attached to Assignments or Events in the Calendar. Grading/Feedback Grades are a means to communicate student learning to both the learner and their families. Students will be graded on projects, assignments, formative and summative assessments as would be expected in the classroom. General Staff Expectations: Staff are expected to work each FID preparing lessons, giving feedback on learning, attending meetings, and interacting with students and families. Collaboration has been emphasized as the key to success and consistency. Staff may not academically penalize a student who is not able to participate regularly in instruction with the understanding that some students may need time for catch-up and remediation when we return to the building. Grace is expected for this circumstance. Teachers have been continually reminded that Distance Learning shouldn't punish students; we lean towards empathy, not violating equity of access. Instrumental Music- online "live" lesson (synchronous) Special Education- online push in support & "live" lessons (synchronous) Counseling - online "live" lessons (synchronous) Gifted - asynchronous and synchronous Accelerated - online "live" lessons (synchronous) Zoom will be the synchronous method for face-to-face meetings and learning. Staff email and communication is regularly communicated, available on both the district website and in each teacher's LMS (SeeSaw or Canvas).

# **IUP EDUCATOR & CLINICIAN PREPARATION FIELD EXPERIENCE AGREEMENT**

This agreement establishes the relationship between Indiana University of Pennsylvania (referred to as the "University"), an educational institution in the State System of Higher Education, Commonwealth of Pennsylvania and Derry Township School District (referred to as the "Organization").

The University offers degree programs in a wide variety of disciplines, which are academically enhanced by practical experiences outside of the traditional classroom setting (referred to as "IUP field experience").

The Organization is able to provide practical experience pursuant to the terms of this agreement and serve as an IUP field experience site offering facilities, resources, and supervision to students.

Both parties agree to the following:

# I. Duties and Responsibilities of the University

- 1. The University shall determine eligibility for students registering in an IUP field experience for academic credit.
- 2. The University shall determine the amount of academic credit to be earned through the IUP field experience and establish all academic requirements that the student must meet to earn the credit. The University shall establish a grading system and criteria to earn the grade upon completion of the IUP field experience.
- 3. The University will assign a faculty member to monitor and evaluate the student's performance during the IUP field experience and be responsible for all costs associated with faculty supervision of the student.
- 4. Upon notification by the Organization of failure of the student to comply with University guidelines and procedures for the field experience program, the University may remove the student from the IUP field experience.
- 5. The Organization understands that as an Agency of the Commonwealth, the University is prohibited from purchasing insurance. As a public university and state instrumentality, there is no statutory authority to purchase insurance and it does not possess insurance documentation. Instead, it participates in the Commonwealth's Tort Claims Self-Insurance Program administered by the Bureau of Risk and Insurance Management of the Pennsylvania Department of General Services. This program covers Commonwealth/University-owned property, employees and officials acting within the scope of their employment, and claims arising out of the University's performance under this agreement, subject to the provisions of the Tort Claims Act, 42 Pa.C.S.A. §§8521, et seq.
- 6. University students shall be responsible for procuring professional liability insurance at their own expense. The limits of the policy shall be at a minimum of \$1,000,000.00 per claim. This policy must remain in full force and effect for the duration of the practicum, internship, or student teaching assignment.
- 7. For and in consideration of placement of student teachers with district cooperating teachers, the University agrees to pay to each cooperating teacher selected to guide the student's experience



- a stipend as outlined by the Pennsylvania State System of Higher Education's Board of Governors Policy 1988-04. This stipend is in addition to the regular salary paid by the School District. In accord with the aforementioned Policy 1988-04, compensation is not extended to district teachers working with University students in pre-clinical, practicum field experiences.
- 8. The University's Teacher Education Office may designate a faculty member to serve as a liaison between the parties who will meet periodically with representatives of the Site in order to discuss, plan and evaluate the experience of the student(s).
- 9. The student teacher or educational specialist candidate will provide all currently required background clearances (Act 114, Act 34, Act 151, Act 24, ACT 126 and TB test) to his or her educator preparation program. This educator preparation program is responsible for maintaining a copy of all clearances. The candidate will retain the original of all clearances. A student placed in non-school setting(s) will acquire clearances as specified by the discipline.

# II. Duties and Responsibilities of the Organization

- 1. The Organization agrees to prepare an IUP field experience description that outlines the duties and responsibilities of the student. The University will use this document to determine the suitability of the IUP field experience for academic credit.
- 2. The Organization agrees to notify the University of any Field Experience Participation Requirements, such as background investigations, drug testing, and health screenings.
- 3. The Organization reserves the right to select students based on the Organization's needs and preferences.
- 4. The Organization may determine the schedule that the student will maintain on premises.
- 5. The Organization acknowledges it will not be compensated by the University for the IUP field experience and the Organization shall be solely responsible for determining the amount of compensation, if any, received by the student. The Organization will inform the University if the student will receive an hourly wage, stipend or if they will serve in a non-paid capacity.
- 6. The Organization agrees to provide suitable space and resources for the student to complete the field experience assignment. The Organization will provide orientation, training, and supervision.
- 7. The Site shall provide either a site supervisor or a cooperating teacher who will supervise student activities during the clinical experience or student teaching.
- 8. The Organization shall provide mutually agreed upon information on a student's IUP field experience.
- 9. The Organization agrees to make reasonable accommodation to the University's request for a faculty site visit during a student's IUP field experience.
- 10. Should the Organization become dissatisfied with the performance of a student, the Organization may request the IUP field experience be terminated. If for any reasons the IUP field experience should be terminated, the organization should notify the University.



- 11. The Site shall protect the confidentiality of student records as dictated by the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA) and shall release no information absent written consent of the student unless required to do so by law or as dictated by the terms of this Agreement.
- 12. For Teacher Education placements, each cooperating teacher or practicum teacher selected to supervise the student teacher or practicum student shall hold a current Pennsylvania certificate in the subject area/grade level to which the student is assigned. The teacher will have a minimum of three (3) years of full-time experience and have been in his/her current assignment for a minimum of one (1) year.
- 13. The Site shall comply with the appropriate Pennsylvania statutes prohibiting student teachers to be used as substitute teachers at any time during their student teaching assignments.

### III. Mutual Terms and Conditions

- 1. This agreement will last for five (5) years from the date of the final signature below. Either the University or the Organization may terminate this agreement with ninety (90) days' notice. In the event of a substantial breach, either party may terminate this agreement. Should the Organization wish to terminate the agreement prior to the completion of a semester/term, any student intern(s) will have the opportunity to complete their IUP field experience.
- 2. The parties agree to continue their respective policies of nondiscrimination based on Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964 in regard to sex, age, race, color, creed, national origin, Title VII of the Civil Rights Act of 1964 in regard to sex, race, color, national origin, and religion, Title IX of the Education Amendments of 1972 in regards to sex and other applicable laws, as well as the provisions of the Americans with Disabilities Act. The Organization agrees to cooperate with the University in its investigation of claims of discrimination or harassment.
- 3. The Organization shall report any incident in which a student is the victim of sexual assault, dating violence, domestic violence, stalking or sexual harassment to the University Title IX Coordinator, Phone: (724)-357-3402, title-ix@iup.edu. The site shall identify resources, such as medical care and counselling that are available to any student who has been the victim of sexual assault, dating violence, domestic violence or stalking.
- 4. The laws of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania shall govern this agreement.
- 5. The relationship between the parties to this agreement to each other is that of independent contractors. The relationship of the parties to this agreement with each other shall not be construed to constitute a partnership, joint venture or any other relationship, other than that of independent contractors.
- 6. Neither of the parties shall assume any liabilities to each other. As to liability to each other or death to persons, or damages to property, the parties do not waive any defense as a result of entering into this agreement. This provision shall not be construed to limit the Commonwealth's rights, claims or defenses which arise as a matter of law pursuant to any provisions of this agreement. This provision shall not be construed to limit the sovereign immunity of the Commonwealth or of the State System of Higher Education or the University.
- 7. This agreement represents the entire understanding between the parties. This agreement shall only be modified in writing with the same formality as the original agreement.

### STUDENT AFFILIATION AGREEMENT FOR TEMPLE UNIVERSITY STUDENTS AT NON-TU ENTITIES

This Student Affiliation Agreement ("<u>Agreement</u>") is entered into as of this <u>20th</u> day of May, 2024 (the "Effective Date") by and between TEMPLE UNIVERSITY – OF THE COMMONWEALTH SYSTEM OF HIGHER EDUCATION on behalf of its College of Education, School Psychology Program ("UNIVERSITY") and the DERRY TOWNSHIP SCHOOL DISTRICT ("AFFILIATE").

### WITNESSETH

WHEREAS, AFFILIATE and UNIVERSITY have an interest in supporting educational programs and in working cooperatively with other institutions dedicated to public service and educational endeavors; and

WHEREAS, AFFILIATE and UNIVERSITY agree that patient/client/student care can best be achieved and facilitated when a stimulating educational environment is maintained; and

WHEREAS, it is in the interest of AFFILIATE to participate in the training and education of students studying School Psychology the "<u>Program</u>") to help meet the needs of our Commonwealth.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual covenants contained herein, good and valuable consideration, the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged, and intending to be legally bound hereby, UNIVERSITY and AFFILIATE agree as follows:

- 1. <u>Term.</u> This Agreement shall continue from the Effective Date above unless either party gives written notice of termination to the other party at least ninety (90) days prior to the desired termination date.
- 2. **Program Requirements.** AFFILIATE and UNIVERSITY agree that the training Program at AFFILIATE shall adhere to the Statement of Program Requirements ("Program Requirements"), attached hereto as Attachment "A" and fully incorporated herein by reference. Each Party will use reasonable efforts to ensure its personnel comply with all Program Requirements, and shall provide a copy of the Program Requirements to all applicable personnel with responsibility for implementing the training Program at AFFILIATE. Both parties acknowledge the Program Requirements are necessary as a condition of the Program for Students to fulfill academic and professional certification and licensure requirements. If either party anticipates they will be unable to meet the Program Requirements, such party shall immediately inform the other party so that appropriate accommodations can be made to ensure the students can meet their certification and/or licensure requirements.
- 3. <u>Rules and Regulations</u>. UNIVERSITY shall require each of its students to be aware of, and abide by AFFILIATE's accreditation standards as well as the practices, rules, policies, and procedures of AFFILIATE.
- 4. <u>Discipline</u>. UNIVERSITY shall have full responsibility for conducting any student disciplinary proceedings in accordance with its own rules and regulations. Notwithstanding the above, UNIVERSITY agrees to terminate the participation of any

student at AFFILIATE's facilities, upon request of AFFILIATE, if AFFILIATE has determined that the student fails to abide by the practices, rules, policies, or procedures of AFFILIATE or in any way threatens to impair the delivery of services to AFFILIATE's patients/clients/students.

- 5. <u>Educational Records</u>. UNIVERSITY shall maintain all educational records and reports relating to the participation by individual students at AFFILIATE for six (6) years from the date of graduation, and AFFILIATE shall have no responsibility to maintain any records. In the event of pending litigation involving such records, those records shall be maintained until a resolution of the legal action is reached. AFFILIATE will refer all requests for information respecting such records to UNIVERSITY.
- 6. <u>Health Status</u>. UNIVERSITY shall insure that all students placed at AFFILIATE have a recent tuberculosis skin test.
- 7. <u>Students Assigned</u>. UNIVERSITY shall assign only those students who have satisfactorily completed the required course of study for the current rotation and who meet AFFILIATE's and UNIVERSITY's standards of health and ability. UNIVERSITY and AFFILIATE shall annually agree upon the number and schedule for such students.
- 8. <u>Confidentiality</u>. UNIVERSITY shall insure that all its students placed at AFFILIATE have been educated as to the concepts of privilege and confidentiality in schools as well as executing and complying with the terms and conditions contained in Attachment "B".
- 9. <u>Independent Contractor</u>. UNIVERSITY shall notify each student that: (a) he/she shall not be deemed to be an employee of AFFILIATE for purposes of compensation, fringe benefits, workers' compensation, unemployment compensation, minimum wage laws, income tax withholding, social security or any program because of participation in this educational experience; (b) each student is placed with AFFILIATE as a part of an academic curriculum and those duties performed by the student are not performed as an employee, but in fulfillment of these academic requirements; and (c) the student shall not, at any time, replace or substitute for any employee of AFFILIATE.
- 10. <u>Insurance</u>. Each party shall provide and maintain Comprehensive General Liability and Professional Liability Insurance for itself, its agents, its employees, and its students participating in this Program at levels sufficient to support the indemnification obligations assumed herein. In no event shall the professional liability insurance coverage be in an amount less than required by The Commonwealth of Pennsylvania or One Million Dollar (\$1,000,000) per claim and Three Million Dollars (\$3,000,000) in the aggregate, whichever is greater. In the event that a party maintains professional liability insurance on a claims made basis, such party shall secure and maintain tail coverage insurance. Upon request of a party, the other party shall supply certificates of insurance evidencing such coverage. Both parties are prohibited from accepting service of legal papers on behalf of the other party, its agents or any of its insured. AFFILIATE's insurance shall be primary and non-contributory to any of UNIVERSITY's insurance policies. This section shall survive the expiration or termination of this Agreement.
- 11. **Indemnification**. Each party shall indemnify, defend, and hold the other party,

its affiliates and their respective trustees, governors, directors, officers, employees, contractors, subcontractors, and agents (collectively, the "Indemnified Parties") harmless from and against any and all liabilities, suits, actions, claims, demands, damages, losses, expenses, and costs of every kind and character (including, without limitation, reasonable attorney fees court costs, and expert witness fees) suffered or incurred by, or asserted or imposed against the party seeking indemnification (or its Indemnified Parties) to the extent resulting from, connected with, or arising out of any negligent or wrongful act or omission by the indemnifying party (or its Indemnified Parties).

- 12. <u>Emergency Medical Treatment</u>. If any of UNIVERSITY's students participating in the program covered by this Agreement should require emergency medical treatment while at AFFILIATE, AFFILIATE will provide the required treatment at a fee no greater than customarily charged to the general public and/or obtain emergency medical services for the student on the same basis as AFFILIATE's own employees. Any expenses charged for such treatment or services shall be the sole responsibility of the student.
- 13. **Training.** AFFILIATE shall provide a school-based training experience for UNIVERSITY's students which meets the mutually agreed upon objectives designed for the educational experience of such students.
- 14. <u>Supervision and Client/Student Care</u>. AFFILIATE shall provide supervision of all client/student care activities and shall have full responsibility and authority over AFFILIATE's administration and client/student care.
- 15. <u>Name and Logo</u>. No party shall use the other's name or logo in any descriptive or promotional literature or communication of any kind without the other's prior written approval.
- 16. **Publications**. Students must obtain prior written approval of AFFILIATE and UNIVERSITY before publishing any material relating to the program experience.
- 17. **Exclusivity**. This Agreement is not intended to conflict with or affect any existing or future affiliation between the parties and institutions not a party to this Agreement. This Agreement is not exclusive.
- 18. <u>Applicable Law</u>. This Agreement shall be deemed to have been made and shall be construed in accordance with the laws of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, without regard to its choice of law doctrine.
- 19. <u>Entire Agreement</u>. This Agreement constitutes the entire agreement between the parties with respect to the subject matter hereof and all prior discussions, agreements or understandings, whether verbal or in writing, are hereby merged into this Agreement.
- 20. <u>Amendment</u>. No amendment or modification to this Agreement shall be effective unless the same is in writing, signed by the parties to be charged.
- 21. <u>Non-Discrimination</u>. - 23. <u>Severability</u>. If any provision of this Agreement shall be declared by a court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid, or the parties determine any provision to be in conflict with any applicable federal, state or local law or regulation, then the remaining provisions of this Agreement shall be unaffected thereby and shall remain in full force and effect.
- 24. **<u>Authority</u>**. Each party represents that it has the authority to enter into and be bound by this Agreement.
- 25. <u>Waiver</u>. The waiver of a breach of any of the terms hereof shall not be deemed a waiver of any subsequent breach or default whether of the same or similar nature and shall not in any way affect the other terms hereof. No waiver shall be valid or binding unless in writing and signed by the parties.
- 26. <u>Facilities</u>. UNIVERSITY's students may not have access to AFFILIATE's facilities for any reason other than clinical instruction unless permission has been obtained from appropriate AFFILIATE personnel in advance.
- 27. <u>Notices</u>. Any notice required to be provided under the terms and provisions of this Agreement shall be in writing, and shall be deemed to be delivered when deposited in the United States mail or national delivery service such as UPS or Federal Express, postage prepaid, certified mail, return receipt requested, and addressed to the respective party at the address set forth below, or any such address as may specify by written notice given to the other party in the manner specified herein:

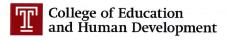

# STATEMENT OF PROGRAM REQUIREMENTS FOR

### SCHOOL PSYCHOLOGY PROGRAM Ed.S. PRACTICUM PLACEMENT

This Statement of Program Requirements sets forth the requirements for the School Psychology Program Internship Placement at the practicum site, including the responsibilities of Temple University's School Psychology Program, the graduate student trainee, and the practicum site. Student trainees will be placed in schools or agencies to receive practicum experience during the academic year.

Based on training standards from National Association of School Psychologists (NASP) and Pennsylvania Department of Education (PDE), the School Psychology Intern will participate in comprehensive school psychological serve delivery including but not limited to: Comprehensive Evaluations, Functional Behavioral Assessments, Progress Monitoring, Consultation, Academic Interventions (must include one NASP case study), Behavioral/Social Emotional Interventions (must include one NASP case study), Counseling/mental health interventions, social-emotional learning, crisis prevention, intervention, and planning, parent feedback meetings, IEP meetings, delivery of inservice trainings, multi-tiered systems of support, program development, professional development, and other activities as specified by site supervisor and faculty supervisor.

### Site Responsibilities

- A copy of this Statement of Program Requirements shall be provided to all staff members at the Internship Site with responsibility for implementing or supervising the Internship.
- Site must pay intern an agreed upon stipend.
- Sites hold ultimate responsibility for patient, client, or student welfare.
- The trainee's experiences will closely parallel those of a full-time staff member, but trainee shall not replace or substitute for any employee of the Internship Site.
- A trainee shall not be allowed to work after normal hours without the on-site presence of a professional staff member.
- All written reports by the trainee should be counter-signed by the appropriate personnel on site.
- The site shall provide the trainee with a primary field supervisor meets the criteria set above.
- The primary field supervisor shall meet with the trainee for a minimum of two hours per week of individual supervision (administrative guidance shall be provided by the site as needed).
- The site shall provide group supervision, training or other supervision of two hours per week.
- The field supervisor shall directly observe some portion of the clinical services provided by the trainee, either live or by audio or video recording.
- The field supervisor will provide a formal evaluation of the trainee's performance once per semester, using the rating form provided by the university supervisor.

- All other professionals may be used in an adjunct capacity for training or supervision.
- The site shall provide a suitable workspace and materials for trainee.
- The maximum title permitted the trainee in his/her role is "school psychology trainee" or "school psychology intern"
- Premature termination of the practicum may be initiated by either the field supervisor or the faculty supervisor with justifiable reasons upon no less than thirty days' advance written notice to the other party.

## Supervisor Qualifications for Internship:

- Appropriately credentialed in the jurisdiction of the placement site (school psychology certification for school placements; psychology licensure for clinical placements)
- Employed at the training site for at least one year
- Minimum of three years of post-degree experience in school psychology (school placements only)

# **Student Responsibilities**

- Trainees are expected to be punctual, maintain good professional work habits, and conduct their client/student and colleague relationships in accordance with ethical principles and the rules of the school or agency in which they are placed.
- Trainees are required to have been cleared by the Office of Field Placements (i.e., by completing all steps in the clearance process required by Temple University students).
- Trainees are expected to follow the training plan agreed upon by both the faculty supervisor and the field supervisor.
- Trainee must be enrolled in at least one credit of practicum course during all semesters in which they complete placements and attend seminars associated with the course.
- Trainees are expected to hold student liability insurance.
- Trainees are expected to share their practicum syllabus with their supervisors.
- Trainee must attend weekly group or individual supervision with the University supervisor.
- Trainee must negotiate time off with the Field Supervisor in advance.
- Trainee must complete all assignments for the University in a timely manner and if a deadline extension is needed to contact the University Faculty for consideration.

### **School Psychology Program Responsibilities**

- The School Psychology Program will provide the site with suitable candidates for field placement through the Field Placement Coordinator or the Program Coordinator. The site may accept or reject the candidate dependent on its own procedures.
- Temple University retains the ultimate responsibility for the academic training and quality of the academic work of the student trainee.
- Temple University faculty supervisor will be available to discuss and meet to collaborate on solutions if issues or concerns arise.
- Temple University faculty supervisor will Provide consistent and on-going consultation with students on case studies.
- Trainee practicum placement will begin at the start of the fall semester and continue through the end of the spring semester or summer term when appropriate.
- Trainees are covered by a comprehensive, broad malpractice policy of Temple University as long as no violations of trainee status occur.
- Premature termination of the practicum may be initiated by either the field supervisor or the faculty supervisor with justifiable reasons upon no less than thirty days' advance written

notice to the other party.

#### 1) Sponsorship Agreement

We are in the second year of our current five-year agreement (2022-23 to 2026-27). As a reminder, the first year – 2022-23 – contained no increase from the prior year). The current and next three years, fiscal years 2023-24 to 2026-27 will increase by 2.5% annually.

# 2) Select College Updates

- a. **Employees.** Currently, the College employs 1,559 full and part-time employees on all five campuses. Of that number, 993 are full- and part-time instructors/faculty.
- b. Accreditations: Culinary, Medical Diagnotistic Sonography and Respiratory Care. Over the past three weeks, Culinary, MDS, and Respiratory Therapy programs were audited by their respective accrediting bodies and both programs were recognized, without exception, for their excellence.
- c. **Diversity, Equity, Inclusion and Belonging (DEIB).** Our Men of Color program is growing and helping its members thrive. Retention efforts among our men and women of color continue to grow and get stronger.
- d. **Vice President of Finance**. We are currently interviewing a pool of candidates for this position.
- e. **Facilities**: We will be converting our tennis courts into pickleball courts. Our pool, which has been closed for four years, is currently be converted into usable spaces.
- f. Law Enforcement Facility. This facility remains closed as we continue to clean and upgrade equipment. - 3) Select Workforce Development initiatives This year HACC partnered with West Shore School District and Middletown Area School District to offer welding classes for high school students (HACC Academy).
  - a. In April, staff presented to Central Dauphin School District and the School District of Lancaster (SDol) to help English Language learners (ELLs) transition to either Workforce Development to Academic ESL programs.

- b. Human Service created a Direct Service Certification in partnership with the ARC of Cumberland to support quality staffing for person's with disabilities.
- c. The Fire program initiated a pilot Traffic Incident Management as a new Firefighting Professional Certification in partnership with Pennsylvania State Fire Academy
- d. The Senator Jeffrey E. Piccola Law Enforcement Firing Range reopens this summer while we celebrate the graduation of the 124<sup>th</sup> Police Academy.

## 4) Select Academic Affairs Initiatives

- a. Academic Affairs launched a new transfer program in Management Information Systems (MIS) that starts in Fall 2024. In additional a new pathway in Secondary and Special Education pathway will launch this Fall.
- b. Application was submitted to pilot IBEST (Integrated Basic Education Skills Training) and IDEA (Integrated Digital English Acceleration), which have a lengthy record of success supporting adult learners in other states. IBEST concurrently teaches adult literacy skills alongside an academic program. IDEA teaches English language and cultural acquisition skills alongside an academic program. Both shorten the time to a well-paying credential for participants.
- c. The Education program faculty established a New MOU with Catherine Hershey School to offer a courses and other activities such as internships. This MOU coincide with the opening of their Harrisburg school.
- d. The Library offers 24/7 chat availability as well as appointments via Zoom, or in person for indepth research assistance.

## • HACC Fiscal Year 2024-25 Budget

Notably, sponsored tuition will decrease by \$13.25 per credit to \$187.50 per credit.

#### 6) Enrollment Data for Students Who Graduated From District Schools

The headcount from Spring 2023 to Spring 2024, increased by 176 students. That is a 6.7% increase from last year's value of 2,632 to this year's value of 2,808 students.

In credit hours from Spring 2023 to Spring 2024, HACC saw an increase of 1,528.5 credit hours from students who formerly or currently attend high schools in our sponsored school districts. That represents a 7.4% increase from 20,523 to 22,051.5 credit hours.

Seventeen high schools had 50 or more students attending HACC, and 16 had an increase in credit hours.
