

Getting Familiar with Literacy Pro

Help your child log in to Literacy Pro using a computer, tablet, or smartphone. If you don't have a login yet, reach out to your child's teacher.



Have your child log in to Literacy Pro.

If your child is a first-time user, complete the Student Interest Survey together and set reading goals. We recommend 20 minutes a day, five days per week

Look at the "Explore" tab.

- Scroll down to see all the ebooks available based on your child's interests and grade level!
- Have your child select a few ebooks to read later by clicking on 🚨 to add them to the "My Books" shelf

Look at the "My Books" tab.

Helpful At-Home Tips

Check in on your child's reading journey! Some suggestions:

Help your child select a new title to read,



Go to "Search" to look for ...

- specific ebook titles
- · a book based on theme, interest, or another category



Review your child's reading activity by looking at their profile and dashboard.

- · Does your child want to change their avatar or update their interests?
- · Is your child making progress toward their reading goals? Does your child want to change their goals?
- · Has your child completed the book?
- . If your child read a print title, did they add their reading minutes to Literacy Pro (i.e., log time)?
- · If your child finished a book, ask, "What did you like about the book? Would you recommend this book to others? Why?" Encourage your child to rate the book and write a review. (Only the teacher will see the written reviews.)

Read an ebook together.

Select an ebook to read. Open it by clicking on the book cover and then selecting

- . Use the e-tools to highlight words and jot down reactions to the text.
- · Click on a word to hear how it's pronounced.
- If the book has the Read-to-Me function (speaker icon), select @ to hear a natural voice read the book.




