The Indiana General Assembly passed SEA 217 regarding the identification of students who may exhibit characteristics of dyslexia.

House Enrolled Act 1108 defines dyslexia as:

A specific learning disability that:

- (1) is neurological in origins and characterized by: difficulties with accurate or fluent word recognition and poor spelling and decoding abilities;
- (2) typically results from a deficit in the phonological component of language that is often unexpected in relation to other cognitive abilities and the provision of effective classroom instruction;
- (3) may include problems in reading comprehension and reduced reading experience that can impede the growth of vocabulary and background knowledge; and
- (4) may require the provision of special education services after an eligibility determination is made in accordance with Article 7.

As part of this legislation, schools shall report on their website the following information:

- The dyslexia intervention program(s) used during the 2023-2024 school year
 - Orton Gillingham, Heggerty, Read Naturally, Phonics for Reading, LLE, Foundations, UFLI, Words Their Way, Fast Phonics, Letter Tracing, Fast Phonics, Dibels, Reading Eggs, IXL, Sound Partners, 95% Group Literacy
- The number of students who received dyslexia intervention during the 2023-2024 school year
 - 307
- The number of students identified with dyslexia during the 2023-2024 school year
 - 7
