ATTENDANCE IS KEY FOR SUCCESS

Ohio schools must report student absences as part of House Bill 410. **Schools are required to develop <u>Absence Intervention Plans</u>** for students who exceed absence limits outlined in the law. Families



will receive auto generated letters as notifications from the district indicating the **number of hours** your child has missed in accordance with these laws. Absences exceeding 38 hours in a month, or 65 hours in a year will require medical documentation in order to be considered excused. Should you have an ongoing medical concern, please contact our office.

By law, **Excessive Absence** is defined as:

- absent 38 or more hours in a month with or without an excuse or
- absent 65 more hours in a year with or without an excuse

By law, **Habitual Truancy** is defined as:

absent 30 or more consecutive hours without a legitimate excuse,


- · absent 42 or more hours in one month without a legitimate excuse, or
- absent 72 or more hours in one year without a legitimate excuse.

*Hours also include total number of minutes tardy to school and early dismissal.

NOVEMBER SOCIAL EMOTIONAL LEARNING: SELF-MANAGEMENT

<u>SELF-MANAGEMENT:</u> is to manage one's emotions, thoughts & behaviors effectively in different situations & to achieve goals. This includes to delay gratification, manage stress, feel motivation & accomplish personal/collective goals, such as:



- Identifying & using stress-management strategies
- Exhibiting self-discipline & self-motivation
- Setting personal & collective goals
- · Using planning & organizational skills
- · Showing the courage to take initiative
- · Demonstrating personal & collective agency



<u>Managing Emotions</u> is choosing socially, healthy ways to express & handle strong emotions. *Big Ideas*

- Recognize what I am feeling and what happened right before I had the feeling
- Remind myself that it's okay to feel what I'm feeling but it's not okay to hurt others
- Take time to calm down
 - Take deep breaths
 - Count to 10
 - Choose another calm-down strategy
- Use my words to say how I feel and what I wish would happen
- Ask for help if I cannot solve the problem myself

<u>Goal-Setting</u> is selecting/articulating something you wish to achieve.

Big Ideas

- What do I want to achieve? Write down my goal.
- Make sure it is specific as possible and I know when I want to achieve it
- What steps will I need to take to achieve that goal? Write the steps down under the goal.

BEFORE & AFTER SCHOOL PLAYGROUND & CONDUCT

As outlined in the school handbook, we do not provide supervision of students prior to 8:45am and after 3:05 pm. Please remind your child that he/she is expected to go directly home after school. Students are not permitted on the playground before or after school from 3:05-4:00pm without adult supervision. The playground is closed when it is being used by after care from 4:00-6:00pm. Children having difficulty with appropriate behavior before or after school may result in school discipline.



CELL PHONE & PERSONAL ELECTRONIC DEVICES

Student personal cell phones/electronic devices shall be turned off and put away in backpacks while on school property. If a caretaker needs to contact a child, please contact the school office at 216-529-4254. More details can be found in the handbook

at the end of this newsletter.

BIRTHDAY TREATS

Should you choose to send a treat for a special occasion, please schedule it with the classroom

teacher ahead of time & drop the treat off at the office. The teacher may set aside a few minutes

for the treat, or they may send it home. For the health & safety of our students, treats must follow these guidelines:



- Treats should be small and store bought. This allows us to avoid concerns over food allergies because the ingredients are listed on the package.
- Treats should not require utensils or need refrigeration. Treats that need to be cut into pieces cannot be accepted.
- Families should consider sending a favor or small trinket instead of food.
- Please save decorative items (balloons, flowers, etc) for your home.

We reserve the right to refuse a treat that does not follow these guidelines.

IMPORTANT REMINDERS

- LAYER CLOTHING & BRING A JACKET: The weather is now changing. TIP: label the tag using a thin permanent marker.
- LABELING water bottles & lunch boxes is helpful
- CHROMEBOOKS should be charged & wiped down at home. We do not have enough outlets for the class. Labeling student power cords is recommended.
- PLANS: Be sure your child knows how he/she is getting home daily, and keep it consistent. If you have a change, please call our office before 2:00pm.
- BREAKFAST is available at 8:30AM at the main entrance & ends at 8:50 so that students can arrive on time.
- ARRIVAL is at 8:45AM and those not coming for breakfast should not arrive earlier, as there is no adult supervision. Playing on the playground is prohibited at this time.



- AT DISMISSAL: Students must go directly home after school.
- ARRIVAL & DISMISSAL CAR LINE: Please pull all the way up to the stop sign. Adults must stay in the vehicle, to keep everyone safe. We will load students on the right side, the curb side. If you need to get out of the car, a parking spot is to be used. Please display the car line pick up signs. The bolder the print, the better. Thank you for following our process.
- DOUBLE PARKING is never allowed as it blocks neighbors & creates a safety hazard.
- SAFETY: Review important pedestrian safety with your children including awareness of surroundings, looking left-right-left, use of sidewalk and crosswalks and crossing guard. Click here for more information
