
Carson's mission is to ensure that all students are empowered and inspired to learn, grow, and graduate prepared to lead a rewarding and responsible life as a contributing member of our community and greater society. Our staff provides students with an education that is academically rigorous while, at the same time, teaches students skills to be emotionally and physically ready for the global workplace. At Rachel Carson, we take pride in teaching our students character traits that are vital for success. Not only do we explain these traits but also put them into practice as kindness and compassion are seen every day in our classrooms, hallways, lunchroom, and at recess.

2022-23 School Goals

Grade level teams met to discuss strategies to be used to increase performance in selected areas. Staff met to compare strategies, examine interventions and decide on challenge opportunities for students. Students needing interventions received additional support.

- Grades K-2 Reading: 89% of students will be at standard on End of Year DIBELS assessments in Spring 2018
- Grades 3-5 English Language Arts: 90% at standard
- Grades 3-5 Math: 89% at standard
- Grade 5 science: 85% at standard
- Achievement gap: Within Concepts and Procedures in 3rd grade students will increase from 50% meeting standard to 75% meeting standard as measured by the SBA.
- School Effectiveness: Increase the number of "Agree Completely" from 48% to 55% in "Staff feels free to express their ideas and opinions with one another"
- Attendance: Decrease the number of student absences on Tuesdays, the most frequently missed day of the week, by 5% as measured by yearly attendance data
- Discipline: Reduce the number of discipline slips issued by 15%, from 96 in 2016-17 to 82 as measured by the administrative team's discipline log






3rd Grade English Language Arts




4th Grade English Language Arts




5th Grade English Language Arts




3rd Grade Math




4th Grade Math
