
School Description

Emily Dickinson Elementary School is in Redmond, Washington. The first Emily Dickinson Elementary School was built in 1977 and currently houses the Dickinson Preschool. Our current elementary building was built in 1992. We have a total enrollment of 517 students, including preschool. As our students leave Dickinson Elementary, they attend Evergreen Middle School, and then Eastlake High School. In addition to Dickinson Elementary, our campus houses both Dickinson Preschool and Explorer Community School. Our main campus includes three Learning Center classrooms, one Safety Net classroom, a Resource classroom and an English Language Learners classroom. Additionally, many of our students are served through our Highly Capable pullout program.

Our student population is rich with diversity and many of our students speak a variety of languages at home, including: 68% English, 7% Hindi, 7% Telugu, 5% Spanish, and 2% Tamil. Other languages spoken include Malayalam, Marathi, Arabic, Russian, Chinese, Hebrew and Kannada.

2022-23 School Goals


Academic goals were set by grade level teams using baseline data from September 2017.

- Grades K-2 Reading: 84% of students at standard on end of year DIBELS
- Grades 3-5 English Language Arts: 78% at standard
- Grades 3-5 Math: 80% at standard
- Grade 5 Science: 74% at standard
- Achievement gap: 43% of students grade 3-5 who receive English Language services, will score at or above grade level standards on the Smarter Balanced Assessment in English Language Arts by May 2019.
- School Effectiveness: Student discipline problems are managed well. Goal is to improve from 83.78% agree completely or agree mostly to 90% agree completely or agree mostly by May 2019.
- Attendance: By the end of the 2018-2019 school year, we will move from 86.75% of our students avoiding chronic absences to 90% of our students avoiding chronic absences.
- Discipline: Our goal is to create a positive behavioral intervention system which identifies the expected behaviors. We will teach, model and practice those behaviors with private or public acknowledgement, and develop a tool to measure outcome data to determine successes and barriers, by May 2019.




3rd Grade English Language Arts




4th Grade English Language Arts




5th Grade English Language Arts




3rd Grade Math




4th Grade Math
