Helen Keller Elementary School is a K-5 school located in Kirkland WA, nestled into a well-established neighborhood in the Juanita region. Students who attend Helen Keller move on to Kamiakin Middle School and graduate from Juanita High School. 

2022-23 School Goals

The process used to determine annual school goals includes an in-depth building-wide analysis. Teachers set grade level goals in both reading and math and 5th grade science.

- K-2 Reading: 85.7% at benchmark on end of year DIBELS
- Grades 3-5 English Language Arts: 71.7% at standard
- Grades 3-5 Math: 76.7% at standard
- Grade 5 science: 80% at standard
- Achievement gap: 81.2% of Hispanic students in K-2 will meet benchmark on DIBELS and 81.2% of Hispanic students in grades 3-5 will meet standard on ELA SBA
- School effectiveness: 80% of staff agree mostly or completely that "staff works in teams across grade levels to help increase student learning"
- Attendance: Increase the average daily attendance rate from 95% to 98%
- Discipline: School administration will have fully implemented a discipline tracking system to communicate discipline issues and focus on re-teaching opportunities





3rd Grade English Language Arts




4th Grade English Language Arts




5th Grade English Language Arts




3rd Grade Math




4th Grade Math
