- This class lost a significant portion of their critical first two Hi School years. While credits were awarded in spring 2020, essential high school habits were not fully developed.













5-Year Graduation Rates



Low Income Comparison










Students with Disabilities Disaggregated

Summary

- More than 3 out of 4 Pasco Students Successfully Graduate in 4 years. Over 90% graduate in 5 years showing strong persistence.
- Highest 4-Year graduation rates:
 - 93.5% Exited EL not included in any other group
 - 90.7% Students not included in any other group
 - 96.6% Non-Low-Income students
 - 93.5% Exited EL students
 - 92.2% Female students
 - 92.1% White students
 - 88.7% All Exited EL students (Includes high mobility)

Summary

- Lowest 4-Year graduation rates:
 - 45.5% Student new in the past 2 years
 - 28.9% If also in SpEd Program
 - 53.7% In SpEd Program
 - 62.0% Students in EL Program
 - 62.2% Student new in the past 4 years
 - 30.0% If also in EL Program
 - o 33.3% If also in SpEd Program
 - 52.1% If male
 - 52.9% If also Low Income

Current Efforts

- Focus on strengthening Tier 1 Instruction
 - Collaborative structures
 - SIOP Sheltered Instruction Observation Protocol
 - Continued focus on PLCs
 - AVID Schoolwide Strategies to increase engagement
 - Learning Logs, Focused Note Taking, Critical Reading Strategies
 - 9th & 10th Grade:
 - Goal setting
 - Weely binder checks
 - Schoolwide advisory lessons
 - High school and Beyond Plans

Current Efforts

- Focus on attendance
 - Daily, weekly, monthly and each trimester data review
 - Contact with students and parents
- Focus on creating a culture of belonging
 - Empathy interviews
 - Belonging indicators
- Intervention Teams
- Targeted Enhancement and Intervention
- Saturday School and Extended Trimester
- After School Tutoring Gear UP

Next Steps

- Continue to align and calibrate:
 - District's Strategic Plans
 - School Improvement Plans
 - State of the School Reviews
 - Consistency progress monitoring data to drive the work.
- Multi-Tier Systems of Support for Academics
 - Align Tier 1 instruction for all
 - Refine intervention system that focus on early intervention
 - Strengthen Credit Retrieval at high schools
 - Expansion of dual language to secondary
- Address the chronic absenteeism districtwide
