This class graduated from RMS with a drive-by graduation and began their freshman year in Google classrooms, rather than the storied hallways of Rye High School. Still, they rebounded beautifully and came out an incredibly well-adjusted and well-rounded class. We wish them all the best as they take the next step on their journeys.
