Back to the Future: Tomorrow's Possibilities



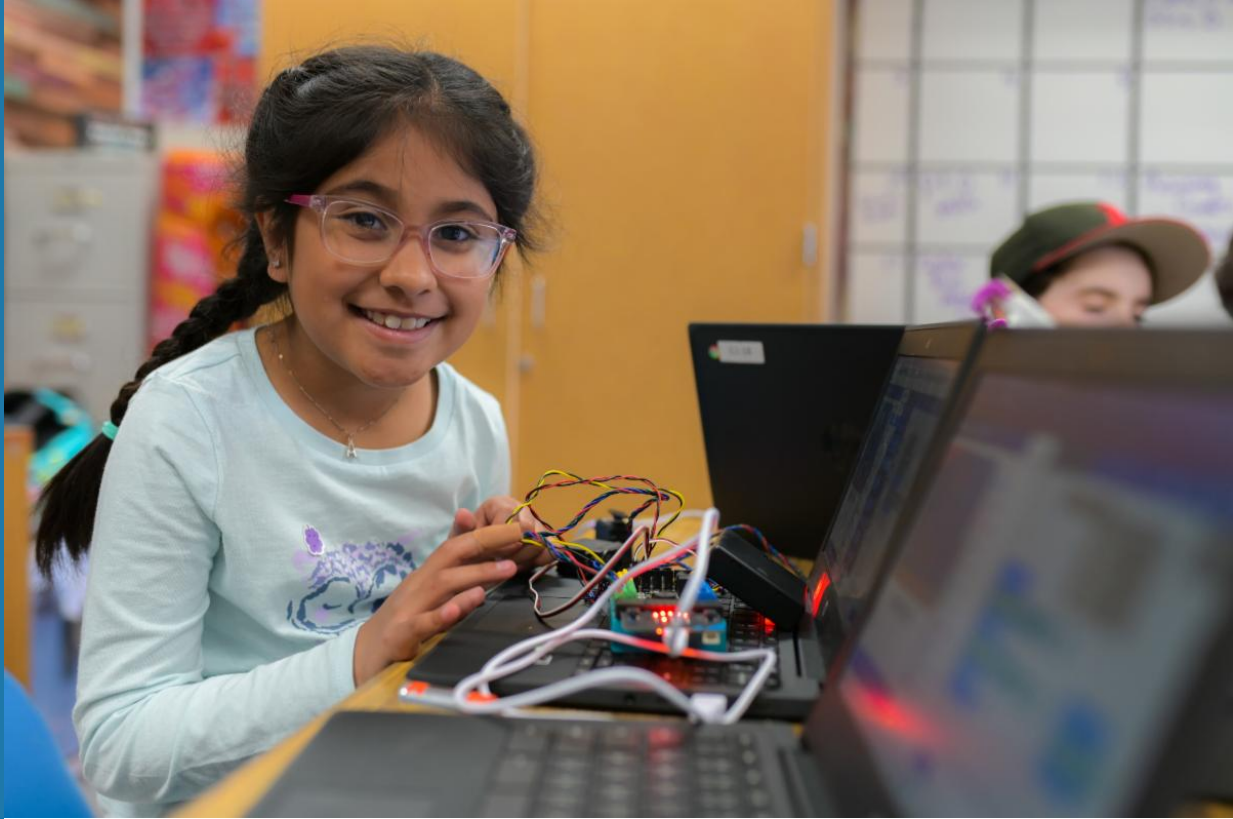
