

The American Revolution and the New Nation was the 40th annual San Bernardino County Academic Decathlon Competition theme for 2023. Nearly 300 students from 18 high schools participated in this year's competition using a hybrid format.

Congratulations to Chaffey High School from Chaffey Joint Union High School District for winning first place overall in the county. This is the second year in a row they have claimed the championship title. The

team's coach and top nine scoring decathletes will represent San Bernardino County at the California Academic Decathlon State Competition in Santa Clara from March 25-26.


