

Itinerant Instruction for Special Education Students

Section A - Introduction

It is the policy of the Board of Education of District #225 to provide itinerant instruction for students whose exceptional characteristics restrict or prohibit school attendance. Itinerant instruction shall not generally exceed a period of 60 school days, unless mutually agreed to by the student's parents and the director of special education.

Section B -

Examples of circumstances under which itinerant instruction is appropriate include but are not limited to the following:

- 1. As an interim program while private school arrangements are being processed.
- 2. As an alternative program when neither private nor public school programs are available.
- 3. As an interim program when severe behavioral factors preclude in-school participation for a brief portion of the school year.

Section C -

Itinerant instruction shall be in lieu of rather than in addition to in-school course participation. Itinerant instruction shall be provided only during the regular school term and shall be provided only on days when District #225 is in session.

Section D -

All itinerant instructors must be state certified and registered with the director of human resources. A District #225 teacher may be permitted to provide itinerant instruction for a student who was in the teacher's class.

Section E -

All itinerant instruction shall require the prior written approval of and shall be arranged by the director of special education.
