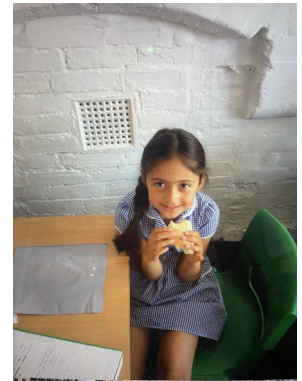

LEARNING SNAPSHOT

Year 1 rounded off their 'Chop, Slice and Mash' topic by making the sandwiches that they designed last week. The children had followed a design criteria for a sandwich that could be sold in supermarkets. They chose their fillings and the type of bread they wanted to use. The children then had a lot of fun making and taste testing their sandwiches before evaluating and considering what they would change next time.

Ask Me: What was in my sandwich?



Year 2 have had great week this week, they have really enjoyed observing their 'class caterpillars' who have grown lots this week - we can't wait to see them continue with their lifecycle and eventually emerge as beautiful butterflies! The children have also been working hard on creating their own 'Magnificent Monarchs' board games in preparation to share with parents at our final express event of the year. Also, they have finished their DT project of creating their own moving greetings cards too.

Ask Me: What is the lifecycle of a butterfly?



Year 3 enjoyed their trip to the Natural History Museum last week! We explored how Botanists (like Sir Joseph Banks) and Voyagers (Captain Cook and his crew) played a vital role back in observing how plants and organisms interact within different habitats. It was lovely to see our families on Sports Day, cheering us on as we participated in a carousel of activities set out on the field. We have really enjoyed our Maths learning this week, from working out how to identify different angles in 2D shapes to describing 3D shapes using mathematical language.

Ask Me: What religion were most people in Britain at the time of the Roman invasion in AD 43?



Year 4 received their Government multiplication check scores and did amazingly well. The average score was 22 out of 25 and 40% of children scored 25/25. We are waiting to see how this compares nationally but based on last year we would be above average. The children have put in so much effort with times tables this year and this is perfect preparation for Year 5 – we are very proud of them all! This week we have focussed on coordinates, creating a large grid in the hall to plot a position. The classroom has been very hot and so the children have enjoyed sitting on the new play equipment, whilst listening to the class reader at the end of the day.

Ask Me: How would I plot a coordinate on a grid?



Reception have been finishing off their On the Beach project this week by making boats out of junk modelling materials, we then turned the paddling pool into the ocean by making the water blue and adding sea creatures. The children have fun setting their boats off to sail and role played waves and attacks from mysterious creatures. We have been discussing safety at the beach and who and what you might find at the beach to help those visiting.

Ask Me: How can you stay safe at the beach and in the sun?

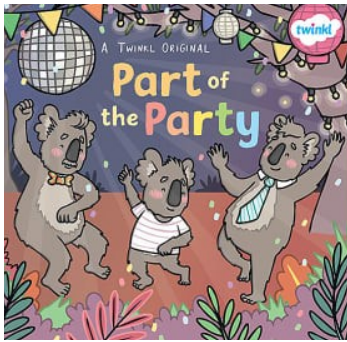


ASSEMBLY - PRIDE MONTH

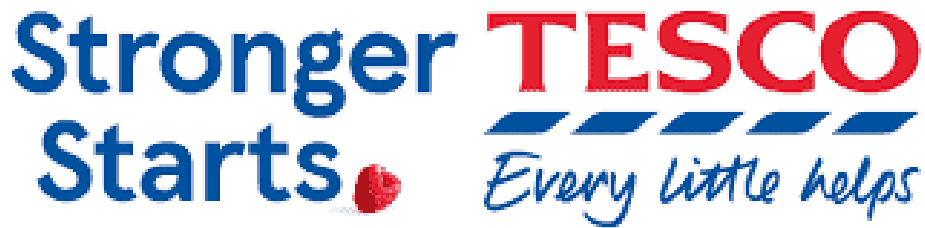
