
SCHOOL BOARD MINUTES COMMITTEE MEETING January 26, 2015 Monday – 6:00 p.m.




Visitors were recognized. Notice for public comment given. Committee evaluated the existing weight room equipment in the Old Armory basement and will give the following recommendations. The two treadmills and the elliptical from the stage are in good shape and will be used in the new room. Equipment that will be moved is the leg press, bicep curl, bench press (with pad replacement), and flat bench (with pad replacement). The machines that will not be used are the back machine, hip flexor, leg curl, sit up bench, and incline bench. The bench press could be used if a spotter's stand could be attached. The Committee would like to consider getting multi-station machines which would replace the squat rack as well as other pieces. Other items the Committee would recommend are rubber coated dumbbell and plate sets, quick release collars, curl bars, and shoulder brackets. Mike Olson and Larry Crowder will visit the Sidney Health Center fitness facility to look over the multi-station machines. Committee moved to the new weight room to assess the space. 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This key funding bill for all state expenditures is split up into Subcommittees during the early days of the Legislature. The OPI budget and Early Edge have been under consideration by the Subcommittee on Education this week. No executive action has been taken as yet.

This important bill that includes the inflationary adjustments to all elements of the funding formula was heard in House Appropriations on 1/22/15 and the Committee passed the bill the same day. The bill passed second reading 92-8 on 1/28 and 94-6 on 1/29. This bill increases not only the Basic and Per ANB Entitlements by inflation, but also includes the other elements of the school funding system as was provided in SB 175 from last session (fiscal note of \$14.3 million in FY16 and \$26.6 million in FY17). The inflationary adjustments are 2.33% in FY2016 and 1.79% in FY2017. The bill also authorizes the natural

resource damage payment which offsets increases in under-base local property taxes. (Cost of the NRD payment are estimated at \$4.9 million in FY16 and \$8.1 million in FY17 – offset by GTB savings of \$2.3 million in FY16 and \$3.7 million in FY17). Referred to Finance & Claims.

This bill was approved by House Education Committee, 15-0 on 1/14/15; passed second reading in the House, 78-19, on 1/19; and third reading, 78-22, on 1/20. It was referred to the Senate Education Committee, where a hearing was held on 1/28. This bill can be characterized as a "clean-up bill" in the area of GTB, making some language changes that do not impact the way GTB is calculated or distributed. The bill also provides an update the use of the bus depreciation reserve fund to allow communication systems and safety devices to be installed on buses. Senate Education Committee concurred, 10-0, on 1/30.

This bill is the product of extensive work over the past Interim by the SAVA Committee and a Subcommittee thereof with MTSBA being involved in all of the discussions. The bill passed as amended on 1/20 from the House State Administration Committee on a 19-1 vote, including an amendment requested by MTSBA related to the school election provisions. Passed second reading in the House 90-10 on 1/21 and third reading, 90-10 on 1/22. Has now been referred to the Senate State Administration Committee. There is a long history to this bill that was developed during the Interim by the SAVA Committee. The bill is nearly 180 pages long and school district provisions account for about 29 of those pages. We believe, as amended, the bill will have minor impacts on school district elections, but those interested in more details are encouraged to contact MTSBA or MASBO. Hearing in Senate State Administration on 2/2 and Committee reported out, 7-0, on 2/4.

MTSBA opposes the bill because it was prepared solely on the sponsor's initiative without consultation by the MTDA or any other education groups and has several technical flaws. One of the key provisions in the sponsor's amended bill is to place an \$80 per class fee on the MTDA to be paid by school districts. This action, done without the knowledge of the MTDA Board has several policy issues that are not dealt with by the bill, including the reaction of school districts to non-public school students or enrollees in their district "costing" the district for participation in the MTDA. The bill passed Committee, 8-7 on 1/28; passed 2nd reading, 53-47 on 2/3; and passed 3rd reading, 52-48, on 2/4. The bill will likely now go to Senate Education Committee.



Senate Education:

This is a bill requested by MTSBA. The key provision of this bill is to extend the ability of a school district to transfer funds from any budgeted or non-budgeted fund to the building reserve for purposes of being spent on safety and security measures (as defined in SB 348 from the 2013 session). The hearing has been set for Friday, February 6 in the Senate Education Committee.
