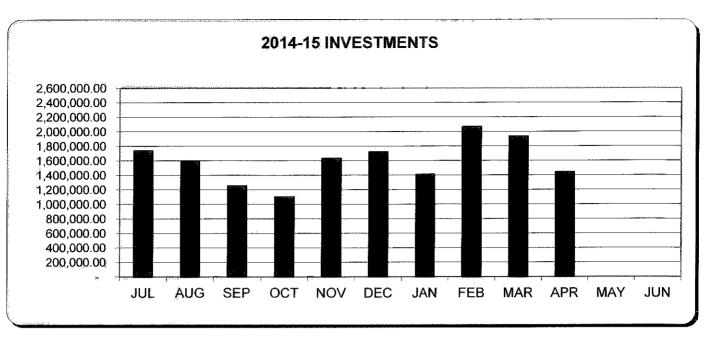

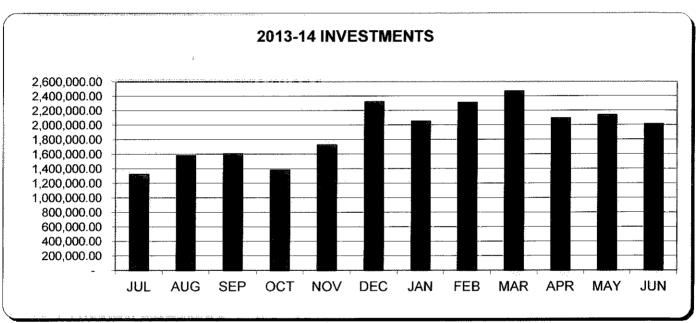

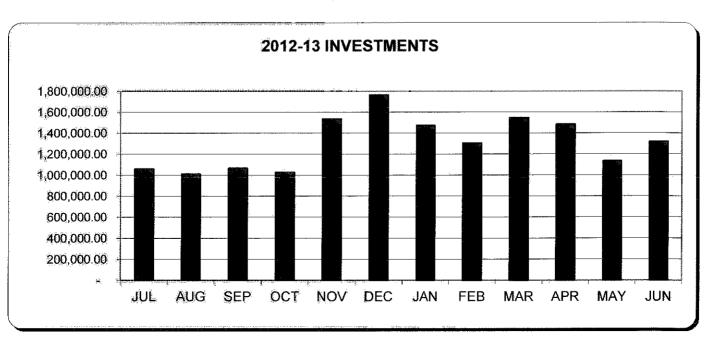

C. Legislative update:

• All of the oil and gas bills made it to the Governor's desk. Two of the three were signed. The only bill to be vetoed was House Bill 423 that would have increased the percentage of oil and gas tax revenue that could be retained from 130% to 150%. Senate Bill 252 will allow the Board more flexibility with the estimation of oil and gas tax revenue. Senate Bill 260 will restructure and reduce our share of the concentric circle distribution of excess oil and gas tax revenue, but this bill does not take effect until July 1st of 2016.
