




In the event of an evacuation, take this card with you. To use this card, fold along dotted lines so the appropriate message is outward facing.

The Standard Response Protocol (SRP) is based on an all-hazards approach as opposed to individual scenarios. Like the Incident Command System (ICS), SRP utilizes clear common language while allowing for flexibility in protocol.

COMMON LANGUAGE





CAN PARENTS OBSERVE OR PARTICIPATE IN THE DRILLS?

The school welcomes parents who wish to observe or participate in drills.

This is important to differentiate between a **drill** and an exercise. A drill is used to create the "Muscle Memory" associated with a practical action. There is no simulation of an event; this is simply programming the action. An exercise simulates an actual event to test the capacity of personnel and equipment.

Parents should recognize that the school will always inform students that it is a drill during the initial announcement that a drill is about to conduct one without causing undue concern and stress.

The school may conduct unscripted drills, however it is highly disallowed for a student-parent to stay outside the school during a drill. That's announced that it as a drill. That's encouraged to conduct one without causing undue concern and stress.

In some cases, students may be evacuated and transported off-site for a student-parent reunification. Parents should be aware that parents can be asked to update their parents on a regular basis.
